I wanted to take a moment and thank everyone for their continued participation at our PASC meetings, as it seems that we have been making progress in our efficiency to conduct the business necessary to serve this Area.

Joey, Michael and myself met up again after Area and we went over the tasks that needed to be accomplished for the month. We discussed the agenda for the next Area meeting and laid it out before we left. Michael followed up by getting the minutes out promptly and via e-mail twice.

I was finally able to get in contact with Chip from St. Luke's to get the dates changed for July and September 2008. She said that she wanted (2) Basic Texts, and (50) current meeting lists for distribution, since those are the items most frequently needed, and usually not readily available for the patients. I told her I would check back later to be sure that this continues to meet the needs of the hospital, and if fewer meeting lists are required. She also said that when giving the literature to someone on the unit, they need to know to put it in her office for later distribution, and not to just leave it out on the unit since it somehow always mysteriously disappears within the span of a day.

We are encouraging not only regions but also areas, groups, and members to share your thoughts on these topics with us. You can answer any or all of the questions, as you like. You will be asked for your contact information in case we need to get in touch with you to clarify anything and whether you are representing a group or service body (and if so, which one). We hope having this online form will help you pass along your ideas more easily. It should assist us in planning for WSC 2008 and the cycle ahead.

Subcommittee Guidelines ad hoc committee, 2/1/2008

To be honest, we didn't get together once in the month of January, but I tried in my own feeble way to fulfill our latest mandate by incorporating the subcommittee guidelines in a draft revision of the PASC guidelines based on the structure January 12th, 2008 version of the Arizona Regional Guidelines. I took the liberty of adding the Service Prayer, the Twelve Traditions and the Twelve Concepts to the draft, in keeping with the ARSC example of publishing the guiding principles behind the work being defined. Since the original PASC draft said it contained a sample agenda but didn't, I added a rather brief one based on our current agenda. I borrowed heavily from the ARSC sections on consensus based decision making, and tried to fit the content of the June 2007 draft of the PASC guidelines into their architecture wherever possible. The ARSC guidelines had a wealth of information about dealing with audits and malfeasance, and I left a lot of that in after a quick search and replace to gear it to the Area. Please feel free to remove any or all of this if, as a fellowship, the consensus is that it's inappropriate or fails to serve the Area's needs. Where I noticed contradictions within the PASC draft, I tried to let the ARSC view of the decision making model and service structure clarify the ambiguity.

Here and there, where entire sections were being retyped, I changed a word or two that sounded inappropriate or misleading. The primary objective with regard to the subcommittee guidelines was to make sure we spelled out the common criteria prior to enumerating the specific policies and procedures of each subcommittee. With the exception of general formatting, I tried to refrain from editorial action within the subcommittee guidelines proper, and there are still phrases present that I can't grasp and holes that need to be filled by the responsible subcommittee. For example one of the functions of the NArathon subcommittee is:

"Select speakers for main meeting, readers for clean time countdown person(s), greeters."

...but it doesn't sound quite right to me. I also left in their "Future Outlooks" section, although it really needs to be a little more formal if the suggestions are to be adopted. A consensus on an outlook is not the same as a consensus on a policy.

The Activities subcommittee guidelines should say something about clean time requirements, especially with regard to the Treasurer. I did take "a leap of faith" that the two signers on the Activities bank account are the Chairperson and the Treasurer, and put this on paper. If this is an invalid assumption, it won't be my first, and I'll trust you to correct it.

Sorry about not getting this posted to the web prior to the PASC. I didn't finish my integration until about 3AM this morning. I'll try to bring plenty of copies on CD if that will help. Anyway, it's been a worthwhile experience for me, even if this draft never sees the light of day. Thanks for letting me attempt to be of service and keeping me clean another twenty-four hours.

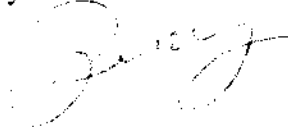
Speaking for myself, I think it was a wonderful event, and we fulfilled our goal of having beautiful places recover and to celebrate the holidays.

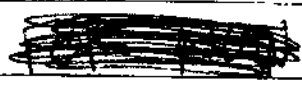
