**Phoenix Area Service Committee
Meeting Minutes for November 1, 2008**

The meeting was called to order by Joey as Chair Joey at 12:30 pm. The Serenity Prayer was read by Joey, followed by the Service Prayer read by John, the 12 Concepts read by Angela, and the 12 Traditions read by Jerry. The GSRs approved last month's Minutes and changed the current month's Agenda to include the GSR Forum issue under Old Business and approved Helpline providing its report at the beginning of Subcommittee Reports. The PASC then welcomed its new GSRs and Alternatie GSRs to the Area.

Roll call was performed by the Secretary Merry. The PASC had a total of 19 GSRs present at the meeting out of 28 active groups. All members of the Executive Committee and Subcommittees were present with the exception of the Vice Chair. Announcements at the meeting included upcoming events with references to flyers and handouts at the meeting. The Chair's report was read by Joey, which included his receipt of Michael's resignation as Vice Chair effective November 1. The Secretary's report was read by Merry, and the RCM reports read by Bethany and Jim (reports attached). The group then heard from two members who requested open forum.

Old Business discussed that the PASC still needs an Alternate Treasurer, and now needs a Vice Chair. Joey has the option to appoint an interim Vice Chair, but he has chosen not to do so and requests the GSRs to bring any nominations to the PASC to hold a special election. Joey requested that GSRs who brought their Area Planning Tools please submit them as we will still be reviewing them at a future date. Joey appointed Patti, from New Freedom, and John from Primary Purpose, to an Ad Hoc Committee to investigate the GSR Forum issue, to include space and time availability for such forum and to present a detailed plan for the forum to the PASC.

Subcommittee reports were then given (attached). The subcommittees were advised to begin working on their budgets, which are due in January, to be approved in February. Four new ideas were presented as follows:

1. That the idea is brought before the Group that all GSRs meet once a month at a pre-determined place where group business/issues can be discussed to help all GSRs recognize and understand the issues that will be discussed at the upcoming area meeting (Tabled to be incorporated by Ad Hoc Committee)
2. For this body to direct the PI Committee to start reaching out to our local halfway houses beyond the current annual mailouts (rejected)
3. For this Area to do a monthly literature donation to local halfway houses so that we will be represented in these houses. This could be done by the Area providing 5 basic texts and 5 It Works or each home group contribute one or the other (the method to be determined if the body approved) (rejected); and
4. Set a per diem amount of \$50/day for approved PASC overnight travel (tabled for group discussion)

The Literature Chair presented his Literature report, followed by the Treasurer's report and disbursement of funds (see attached reports).

The meeting was closed with the Serenity Prayer.

The rollover position takes the calls if the primary volunteers don't pickup; they are also responsible for checking and answering the voice mails. This is a 3 day a week 24 hour a day commitment.

Public Information 20081101

We've been meeting on the 4th Friday of the month at Unlimited Coffee, 741 E Glendale, Phoenix. Our next meeting will be on the 3rd Friday of November since the following Friday is during the Thanksgiving day weekend. At our last meeting, the main focus was the mail-out, then our questions posed at WSLD. Over the last month, we called everyone on our mailout list, revised some names, addresses and phone numbers, dropped a few organizations and added a couple. Most everyone wants samples of Spanish literature, and I don't think we have enough to go around at this point. We'll do the best we can with what we have. First thing I have to do is get mail-merge working for labels with OpenOffice or find somewhere to generate the labels using Microsoft Word - I have a couple of ideas along that line.

The WSLD was as intense as I expected. There was a workshop on technology, and we did explore some of the issues our committee had related to technology, public relations and the traditions. We talked about group and personal web sites, ftp sites and down-loadable resources, text messaging, cell phones, automated helplines, google groups, pod casting, webinars, on-line meetings and chats, youtube, downloading speaker tapes. We also divided up into groups and talked about some hypothetical scenarios.

There were other workshops and presentations on public relations, and it really made me aware that it's all about building relationships, not just putting our information out there. When we discussed this at our Friday meeting, it became apparent that we need to take a look at our guidelines to make sure this is emphasized in our statement of purpose, and we decided we want to change our decision making process to CBD, so that needs to be reflected in the guidelines as well. We considered making a motion to rename our subcommittee from Public Information to Public Relations, since the later term is more widely accepted when dealing with professionals. One con to this idea was that the term may have a "spin" connotation, and it's really more important that we adopt this philosophy as fundamental to the way we do what we do than adopting the name itself. I think we're sticking with Public Information.

One of the workshops divided into groups that did presentations. Definitely something I'd like to try with our subcommittee, once we get everyone on the committee the info on how to do presentations. I'd like to find out what it would cost to get several copies of the PR handbook, since it's all useful information that everyone doing this kind of work needs to have, at their disposal. We also talked about creating a pool of presenters and what to look for.

We also talked at length at WSLD about reaching out to the Hispanic community. In SoCal, they've had great success once they stopped trying to force them into an existing service structure and put the focus on supporting and enabling them. The thing they had to get over was that Spanish was a language boundary, not a geographic one. We're not that far along, but I think we could do a better job of serving them if we let go of some preconceptions, found some champions and did our best to make them successful. I think this is going to be one of our big challenges in the near future, and one that could make a real difference in peoples lives.
