**Phoenix Area Service Committee
Meeting Minutes for December 6, 2008**

The meeting was called to order by Joey as Chair at 12:30 pm. The Serenity Prayer was read by Joey, followed by the Service Prayer read by VandaRay, the 12 Concepts read by Jerry, and the 12 Traditions read by Robin. The GSRs approved last month's Minutes and changed the current month's Agenda for Outreach to present its report immediately following Open Forum, and Narathon to give its report first during Subcommittee Reports. The PASC welcomed home and reinstated two prior groups – New River Any Addict Meeting (Michael T., GSR) and Space Available (Mark H., GSR), and welcomed new GSRs Fred for New Life and David K. for Wild Bunch, and new Alternate GSRs Shannon C. for New Life and Jim P. for Step in Time.

Roll call was performed by the Secretary Merry. The PASC had a total of 24 GSRs present at the meeting out of 30 active groups. All members of the Executive Committee and Subcommittees were present with the exception of the open position of Vice Chair. Announcements at the meeting included the next PASC will be the second Saturday in January (**January 10, 2009**) due to the new years holiday, and upcoming events with references to flyers and handouts. The Chair's report was read by Joey, the Secretary's report was read by Merry, and the RCM reports were read by Bethany and Jim (all reports attached). One member requested open forum.

Old Business discussed that the PASC still needs an Alternate Treasurer and a Vice Chair. Some groups submitted their Area Planning Tools which were due today and Joey will be compiling the information. John K. presented the GSR Forum Ad Hoc Report and the idea to form a GSR Forum was called to a vote and rejected. The tabled idea from October on the same issue was withdrawn by the maker. The idea of a \$50 per diem for approved PASC overnight travel was approved with the amendment that receipts will be provided and any amount not supported by a receipt is to be returned to the PASC. The PASC does not wish to include the regional minutes with the PASC meeting minutes and will call the RCMs do advise if their group wishes to participate in a workshop.

Subcommittee reports were then given (attached). The Narathon Committee report was read by the Chair, followed by Helpline, Public Information, Activities, and H&I (Outreach provided their report earlier). All reports are attached. New business included subcommittee budgets, which need to be submitted by next PASC to be distributed to the groups and voted on in February. The working draft of the PASC Guidelines also need to be voted on and any proposed amendments should be brought to the next PASC. No new ideas were presented.

The Literature Chair presented his Literature report, followed by the Treasurer's report and disbursement of funds (see attached reports).

The meeting was closed with the Serenity Prayer.

The RCM (Regional Committee Member) Forum was very productive. We had continuing discussion on the Regional Meeting Directories (schedules). There was also a lot of discussion on the flow of funds between Areas and Region, this evolved into discussion about what services can be provided by Regional Committees to help relieve some of the burdens too large for individual areas to provide on their own. GSR Forum Report

Ad Hoc Committee Members: Patte T. – Angela K. – Vanda Ray – Danny K. and John K.

After the last PASC it was determined that we, as a collective, rent both the main room and the Theson Room the first Saturday of every month from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm and have done so for quite some time. All we need to do is call security to ask them to open the room up for us.

The PASC GSR Forum could be held in the ^{Theisen}~~Theson~~ Room from 11:00 to 12:00 the first Saturday of the month, and I could make the call each Saturday to security since I'm already here around 10ish for H & I. The GSR Forum would eliminate the need for GSR Orientation as it can be used as means of going over and explaining policies and procedures just as it's done in the West Valley currently. It would need to end promptly at 12:00 though to not interfere with the functioning of PASC. ~~what we suggest is that we schedule it for 11:15 to 12:15 which would give the talkers and the speakers a chance to do their individual things before sitting down for another couple of hours.~~

Before it was realized that we had this additional room at our disposal it was discussed with the Literature Chair whether or not he would be willing to move literature sales into the hallway. This was initially done to reduce distractions during the GSR Forum. The Literature Chair stated that he would ^{have no issue with} ~~much~~ rather meet in the hallway since it is cooler and after discussing it with Greg W. I found that it would be no problem as long as ^{setting up} we were relatively quiet out there because there are other groups going on besides ours. ~~So the Literature Chair agreed that it would be better for him as well though we need to know we have the Theson Room at our disposal right now. We suggest that we still allow Literature to set up in the main lobby area for his comfort and to reduce distractions to him as well as us.~~

Observations from Regional and West Valley Forums:

1. No written format, open discussion
2. Forum would allow us to go over policies and procedures
3. Home Group concerns and business first
4. Discussion of motions, effective wording and intent discussed
5. Forum would allow us to discuss what needs to go back to groups prior to PASC
6. The forum allows Area Service to focus on more business in less time. Ideas can be written in the forum before PASC for discussion, input to achieve consensus in the forum prior to it being brought to the Area floor. If it does not reach consensus in Forum it does not reach the Area it is worked out in the forum
7. The forum allows new GSR's to ask questions more comfortably
8. Allows all GSR's to participate if they choose to
9. To be most effective GSR's would need to be on time
10. Everyone has an opportunity to speak on any issue
11. Respect was obvious with no one personality dominating any part of the discussion
12. It is believed that the forum is one way a descending voice can be heard by peers
13. And the Phoenix Area RCM's have offered to help us establish forum by attending the first two meetings

PURPOSE:

It is our purpose to facilitate, and encourage continued communication where it already exists and better communication where it does not between the Groups and PASC. To better facilitate the transition of Alternate GSRs to GSRs or to help a new GSR that has been recently placed into his/her position. It is also our purpose to help perpetuate clear and direct discussions about new or proposed ideas in order to speed along the process in PASC, and to allow for better communication to our Home Groups.

They wouldn't take our envelopes, and after busting one open and reading through the literature, insisted that it's advertising so we don't qualify for media mail rates, they're too fat for the flat first class rate, and that I take them all back home, weigh each one, put on the appropriate postage with stamps and bring them back and post them myself. And they weren't willing to give me a chart for first class postage. When we talked about this at our meeting, the consensus was that someone else should deal with the post office. Preferably someone cute. Debbie's been doing follow-up call to each recipient and trying to get a specific contact person to add to our database. We seem to be more successful when we can address correspondence to an individual.

We also decided in our meeting that we need to focus on presentations. I participated in West Valley's TSLD in November with the intention of trying to reproduce Jane's presentation workshop, but it became abundantly clear that you either need to prepare the audience ahead of time or expect it to take hours. The TSLD was worthwhile, but they were attempting to run five workshops in parallel all day long, so participation was spread thinly. It was a grand exercise, but I can't help but think it might have gone better if it was scaled back and a little more focused. Robert invited me to participate in a presentation to parents at the same high school that invited us to do a booth earlier this year. He went through the PowerPoint presentation that Greg did at the TSLD and opened it up to Q&A. I think it went quite well, but my impression was that our committee needs to rehearse with the PowerPoint if we want to use this as a tool. We attempted just that at a presentation meeting we held at Nancy's about a week ago. What we ended up with was a lot of markups for changes we want to make to our version of the PowerPoint and a consensus that we need notes that accompany the slides so the presenters have a reference of additional information so we're not just reading the slides as we go through them. We also need supporting info in the notes so when we're asked where the facts come from, we can quickly supply the appropriate answers.

I need to thank the WSO for supplying us with eight copies of the PR handbook and samples of some of the collateral they use in presentations. The handbooks are vital to getting the committee trained and allowing us to attempt many of our objectives within established guidelines and traditions. All they asked in return was that we put our literature out to the community, and that's one of our objectives anyway.

I'm optimistic that our committee will make significant inroads into building relationships with many agencies that come in contact with addicts as well as various media outlets. My strategy is to facilitate the committee members as best I can, coordinate with the other areas and subcommittee chairpersons to avoid duplication of effort, and get out of the way. It's so awesome when you have a great group of people participating in a subcommittee, and all I can say is "thanks". We do need a vice chairperson, so if you know anyone that's inclined, send them our way. We're meeting the 3rd Friday of December at Unlimited Coffee at 7PM to avoid any conflicts with the holiday. Hope to see you there.
