**Phoenix Area Service Committee
Meeting Minutes for January 10, 2009**

The meeting was called to order by Joey as Chair at 12:30 pm. The Serenity Prayer was read by Joey, followed by the Service Prayer read by Robert, the 12 Concepts read by Ron, and the 12 Traditions read by Mike. The GSRs approved last month's Minutes and the current month's Agenda. The PASC welcomed two new groups to the Area- 12 to Life (Edward C., GSR) and Dynamite Recovery (Jack T., GSR).

Roll call was taken by the Secretary. Four groups were removed from the Area roster for non-appearance: Living Clean, Never Alone, Options for Us and Paradise in the Square. Counting the two new groups, there are 28 active groups in the PASC, with 18 GSRs present, establishing quorum. All members of the Executive Committee and Subcommittees were present with the exception of the open position of Vice Chair. Announcements at the meeting included upcoming events, with references to flyers and handouts. Dear Fellow Members,

As Bethany and I discussed with you four PASC meetings ago the possibility of the "Circle of Sisters Women's Convention" is coming up around the Region. I have been approached by several members in the area to address this in my report. I will keep my personal preferences out of this one, however I will speak to our history.

The groups in this area have established again and again that they do not support "roving" events. There is good and prudent reason for this. Roving events do not meet the letter or the spirit of the 5th Concept "For each Responsibility assigned to the service structure a single point of decision and accountability should be clearly defined".

Clearly No Region or Area has assigned this committee to exist. It solicits its own support by seeking out Areas and Regions to "host" it. It is apparent that if it can not get the support of the Region it goes around to individual areas to garner support. It is not responsible (financially) to the host Area or Region, they are responsible to it. Under **Financial Responsibility** : The hosting Area or Region has ultimate financial responsibility for the COS convention it hosts, however the COS Host Committee will make every effort to minimize financial risk. Should there be financial difficulties, the Host Committee shall approach the hosting area or region for guidance.

There are also serious 9th, 5th, and 3rd Tradition infringements in this "committees" guidelines.

If our Region chooses not to host this event and one of our areas decides to go ahead and host it anyway, our Regional Corporation could still be held legally liable for all incurred debts of this convention. Because the Areas are under the same tax I.D. as the Region.

Please understand that although this may look like a good idea to some. In the long run it can end up doing much more damage financially to the whole Region than any message it might carry.

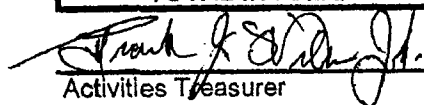
