**Phoenix Area Service Committee
Meeting Minutes for March 7, 2009**

The meeting was called to order by the Vice Chair, Lee Z., at 12:30 pm with the Serenity Prayer. The Service Prayer was read by Danny, the 12 Concepts read by Robin, and the 12 Traditions read by Jim. The GSRs approved last month's Minutes and the current month's Agenda. The PASC welcomed GSR Scott for Progress not Perfection and J.R. with Young and Restless, and new Alternate GSR Walter for 12 to Life.

Roll call was taken by the Secretary. Counting the two new groups, there are 31 active groups in the PASC, with 25 GSRs present, establishing quorum. Absent from the Executive Committee and Subcommittees were the Chair, Joey, and RCM2, Jim B. Announcements at the meeting included upcoming events, with references to flyers and handouts. There was no Chair report in Joey's absence. Lee presented a Vice Chair report and the Secretary's report was read by Merry. The RCM report was read by Bethany. All reports are attached to the Minutes (due to the volume of materials being distributed the RCM attachments are included in a separate packet). No open forum was requested.

Old Business was then addressed. Budgets were distributed with the Minutes last month. The item was tabled for the Executive Committee to compile all proposed budgets into one consolidated document showing all projected costs and income. The Guidelines were approved with final versions to be copied and distributed at PASC. The alternate treasurer position remains open. Discussion was held regarding a possible candidate who does not meet the 5 year requirement, having 4 years clean. GSRs determined a statement of willingness would need to be submitted before possible waiver of the clean time requirement would be addressed.

Reports were presented by all subcommittees; reports are attached.

Eight new Ideas were presented, as follows: (1) That all subcommittee chairs attend Regional Subcommittee of same [rejected]; (2) Can they email the report to us [out of order]; (3) For literature during lean months for Hope for the Slope [rejected]; (4) That new guidelines be hole-punched when changes are made new pages can be printed out and to provide copies of guidelines at PASC [adopted]; (5) and (6) To correct typing errors in Guidelines before printing final [both adopted]; (7) For PASC to carry the cost of the New Times ad [withdrawn] and (8) That GSRs access the new literature for review online and that the web address be put in the minutes [passed].

The Literature Chair presented his report, followed by the Treasurer's report and disbursement of funds (see attached reports).

The meeting was closed with the Serenity Prayer.

EASY DOES IT BLUEBERRY STUFF

1 pkg. Strawberry JELL-O	1 (8-oz.) pkg. Cream Cheese
1 (20-oz.) can Blueberry Filling	1 (8-oz.) pkg. Sour Cream
1 (20-oz.) can Crushed Pineapples	1 tsp. Vanilla
1 (4-oz.) Sugar	1 c. Walnuts

Mix JELL-O with 2 cups boiling water. Let it get a little firm. Add blueberries and pineapples to JELL-O (including juices). Let it get very firm in the refrigerator. Combine sugar, cream cheese, sour cream and vanilla. Beat. Either combine walnuts to topping or just sprinkle the walnuts on top. Hint: Only put the topping on after dessert has hardened. Refrigerate and enjoy.

The last committee meeting was on February 10, 2009. The operation is running well, with no problems to report. We have good coverage. Shifts that could use another volunteer are Wed midnight to 6am, Mon and Tues 6 am to noon and Wed and Fri 6 pm to midnight. I filled 3 shifts this morning. We are also still looking for a first half rollover. This position is Sun, Mon and Tues 24 hours a day. This position is our back up if our frontline volunteers miss the call. We had 2 people ~~to~~ total at the committee meeting including myself, and one volunteer from the Phoenix Area. There were no liaisons in attendance. Public Information 20090307

We met at the Lux on February 27th, and discussed presentations, targeted mailings, media, planning and fiscal prudence.

- 1) We talked about the advantage of having a pool of presenters, the need to conduct ongoing presentation training, and some upcoming presentation opportunities.
- 2) Patte brought her spreadsheets for the targeted mailings and a generic cover letter. We talked about the scope of our mailing targeted at schools, who to contact, and where to get the information. Nancy created a cover letter specific to High School Vice Principals. We also discussed what the content should be for the school mailing and how that differs from the judicial and medical mailings to follow.
- 3) We talked about the New Times add. Looks like West Valley has pulled out, and it sounds like East Valley will follow suit. Sam was there from the East Valley, and gave us an update on their radio PSA initiative. We also discussed doing something similar to the TV PSAs from Austin with the Radio audio track dubbed onto a video clip that just shows people's eyes – no full faced shots.
- 4) We talked about how the mailing time-line was slipping, and entertained the idea that we could compress at least two of the upcoming mailings into a single activity. Depending on the final list of schools, we may be able to do three mailings at once and shrink our schedule back into something that allows us to focus on a media activity in the summer.
- 5) We talked about the budget and how it would make sense to trim it where we can. It looks like we can trim \$440 for the second half of the New Times add, since we doubted that Phoenix would be willing to bare the full cost now that the other areas are pulling out. Literature will drop from \$1500 to around a third of that since we've reduced the number of Informational Pamphlets that go in each mailing. PSA media and duplication goes away now that East Valley has taken this project., and "other media/advertising costs" can be trimmed as well. The combined effect is that we'll reduce our expenses to about half of what was projected.

We conducted a presentation training exercise at Burton Barr on Sunday afternoon, March 1st. It was pulled together quickly and wasn't well attended, but I thought it went OK. We tried to do the two person short pitch. Sam didn't like reading from cards, and I have to agree that it would feel much better if we knew the presentation "down pat" where it wasn't necessary to refer to any aids. Still, the cards do help keep you on track and walking through them makes sure you don't miss any important points that you want to convey.
