Officers Reports:

CHAIR:

May 3rd, 2009

Good afternoon EVA,

I have an area inventory ready to go to home groups. I hope all groups will participate to elp this area better know how well we are fulfilling our primary purpose. I will collect them next month (June) at the area meeting and then prepare a report for August. Please note all questions within this report were accessed either directly through the NA World website or provided to me directly by NA World. This has been another great learning experience for me. Thank you for the opportunity.

If you will remember last month we instituted the three pros and three cons rule as well as the “Point of Information” motion. We will be adding to this “previous Question. This motion is made by a member saying “I call for the questions” or “I move the previous question.” It is another way of saying, “I move that debate stop right now and that we vote immediately.” This motion is in order after any speaker is finished. You need not be called on. The chair must recognize you when you make this motion, a second is required. Then a vote must be taken with no debate. If two-thirds of the body feels that no more debate is necessary, then it is time to vote and move on.

The next item we will add is “Order of the Day”. If a committee member feels that business is going too far astray from the original agenda, that member can help get things back on track. The member says, “I call for the order of the day.” This means, “I move that the chair bring us back on track and conduct the meeting according to procedure, adhering to the agenda.” This does not require a second, is not debatable, and does not even require a vote – the chairperson is obligated to enforce the request unless two-thirds of the body tells the chair otherwise.

Please note both motions do the same thing, keep us on track. However we would use “Previous Question” during motion discussions. “Order of the Day” would be appropriate during reports.

Now we have four very instrumental tools in play at our area. These rules are meant to be used as tools to help us make orderly collective decisions in a cooperative, respectful way in the spirit of our Twelve Concepts.

My Fellow Addicts,

There is a motion for home group vote concerning whether we should allow our Helpline phone number to be placed on a list with other community service phone numbers. I mentioned the PR Subcommittee intended to ask City of Grace church to place our number on such a list which they provide to people with difficulties that may be helpful to them. A copy of the list is provided with these minutes for your review to help make a decision on the motion.

I hope you agree we, the PR Subcommittee, would not be violating any traditions by this action. Our Helpline phone number is published many places where it is possible that some people may

interpret as affiliation which would be a violation of the Sixth Tradition. If there is question within your home group about this motion I would suggest a review of Tradition Six in IT WORKS: HOW AND WHY. Particularly relevant to our view is the first paragraph on page 168. At the risk of being accused of taking information out of context I still choose to quote a couple of important sentences from that paragraph.

“Cooperation with others is healthy for Narcotics Anonymous. Contacts between our groups and the public help others understand NA better. They help increase public goodwill toward NA. They lead doctors, teachers, police, friends, and relatives to recommend NA to addicts who want recovery.”

We sincerely do not believe the act of a pastor or staff member at City of Grace church providing our Helpline phone number on a list with other community service numbers to imply any affiliation or endorsement with Narcotics Anonymous. They are simply helping addicts find us so they can get the help we are so well qualified to give. Please send your group’s conscience with your GSR.

We are gearing up and planning for sponsoring the June East Valley Speaker Meeting and Dance with the flyer posting event planned for the next day. The speaker we have chosen has over 30 years clean time in NA. Gary S. is our Flyer and Poster Task Force Leader and has been doing a wonderful job in Mesa but now we want to cover the entire East Valley in day labor offices, libraries, Laundromats, college lunchroom bulletin boards, etc., and we will provide lists primarily arranged by geographic location. HELPLINE REPORT 5/12/09

The last committee meeting was on May 12, 2009. The operation is running well, with no problems to report. We have good coverage. Shifts that could use another volunteer are Wed and Thurs midnight to 6am, Tues and Thurs 6 am to noon, and Wed noon to 6 pm. **We have found not one but two volunteers for the rollover!!!** We had 5 people total at the last committee meeting including myself, the vice chair and 3 volunteers from the Phoenix Area. Both of our new rollover people showed up! There were no liaisons in attendance; no attendees from East or West Valley areas. There is no clean time requirement to be on the committee.

The Vice chair and I went over Access line procedures, report writing and billing procedures to make the transition to chair smoother.

We will be doing a Helpline workshop in Williams on June 7th for the Peaks area and a TSLD for the Phoenix area on July 18th.

We have 71 volunteers on the primary helpline shifts, 4 on Spanish, 4 on rollover and one on "last house on the block" for a total of 80 volunteers. We also have around 90 to 100 volunteers on our 12 step list.

We had 770 regular calls and 46 voicemails in April

Minimum requirements for a shift are 6 months clean, regular attendance at NA meetings, an NA sponsor, working the steps of NA, and commitment to a 6 hour shift once per week. Training will be provided: these requests should be forwarded to the Chair, Chuck H @ (602) 413-5415, or cbh34na@yahoo.com, or to the Helpline VM box.

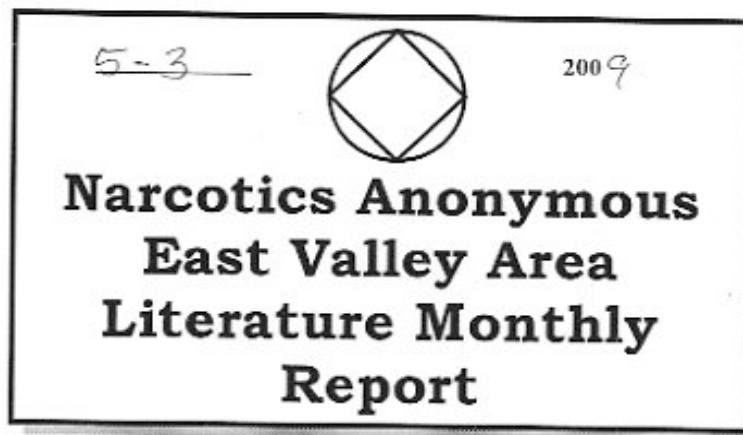

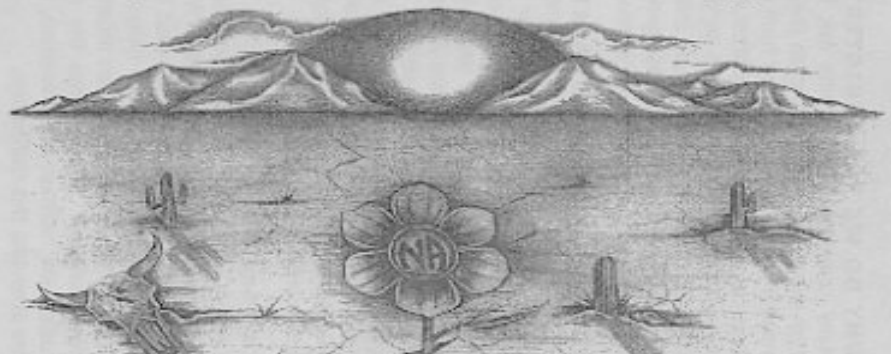

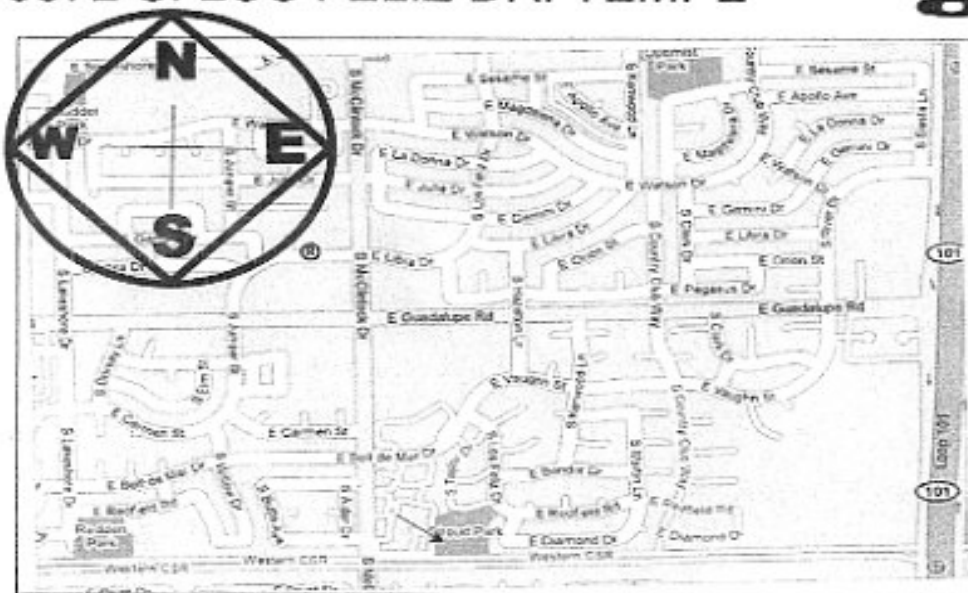
