**Phoenix Area Service Committee  
Meeting Minutes for April 4, 2009**

The meeting was called to order by the Chair, Joey, at 12:30 pm with the Serenity Prayer. The Service Prayer was read by Kevin, the 12 Concepts read by John, and the 12 Traditions read by Danny. The GSRs approved last month's Minutes and the current month's Agenda. The Treasurer provided an Amended report for March. The PASC welcomed new GSRs Seam for End of the Road, Kevin for Positive Living, Rob for North Mountain Candlelight, and John at new Alternative GSR for 12 to Life.

Roll call was taken by the Secretary. Counting the new group, there are 32 active groups in the PASC, with 20 GSRs present, establishing quorum. Space Available has been absent over three consecutive PASC meetings and will not be on the Roll Call for May. The Executive Committee and Subcommittees were all present, with the exception of RCM1, Bethany. Announcements at the meeting included upcoming events, with references to flyers and handouts. Reports were presented by the Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, and RCM2 Jim B. Copies of all reports are attached. There was one request for open forum.

Old Business was then addressed. A consolidated budget was distributed to the GSRs for review and discussion. The GSRs advised the Chair they would like to see a listing of historic income amounts on the budget, and to have the literature items duplicated in the PI, H&I and Literature budgets broken out. The Chair agrees to provide that report and the item is tabled for next month. Paper copies of the Guidelines were distributed, and more will be provided at next month's PASC. The alternate treasurer position remains open.

Reports were presented by all subcommittees; reports are attached.

One new Idea was presented by Robin to "Amend Outreach Subcommittee Operational Guidelines to include TSLD, Consensus Based Decision making and the requirement for the vice-chairperson to have a willingness to serve as chair in the following term." The idea was adopted and amended Outreach Guidelines will be distributed to the GSRs.

The Literature Chair presented his report, followed by the Treasurer's report and disbursement of funds (see attached reports).

The meeting was closed with the Serenity Prayer.

Hi Everyone,

My apologies for missing last months meeting, I had family come in to town unexpectedly from out of state.

One of the prime topics at the Regional GSR Assembly was about why there was such a lack of attendance by some of the larger Areas. And what we can do to improve attendance at future Regional GSR Assemblies. The main item that came out of that discussion was proposed by the Regional Delegate at the following Regional Committee Meeting; **That we (RCMs) ask our Areas for a topic to be discussed at the next assembly, preferably something we are going through now as a Region that we want to resolve.**

**The Regional Board of Directors** is looking to fill 2 positions right away, and 2 by July (10 year clean-time requirement).

**Northern Arizona Area** is meeting again, but they're changing their name to something else because they think the old name is unlucky. They are currently meeting on the same day as the ARSC.

**Chairperson:** We need to look at budgeting, finances and funding. The Chairperson also helped out Yuma with their questions about what they needed to do to meet the needs of the Region with their upcoming convention.

**Regional Delegate:** Leadership in NA (new service pamphlet) is available, 2nd edition Commemorative Edition of the NA Basic text is available, In times of illness revised only has approximately 60 more days to submit input (go to the NAWS website at this point if you want to give input). If you have a personal subscription to any of the print based publications that World Services produces please consider changing your subscription to the on-line or web based version, because this will help reduce costs, freeing up monies that can be used to carry the message in other ways. The Regional GSR Assembly had 40 people in attendance. Thank you Casa Grande for hosting a great event. The Conference Agenda Report will be available in late November (we will need to order early).

**Special Note:** We might want to consider having the next 2 Regional GSR Assemblies close together, one in early January to go over the Conference Agenda Report, so we can discuss the motions and take information back to the Groups, and the second one could be held in March for the GSRs to bring their vote back in time for the World Service Conference.

**NAWS** has updated their website, it is much easier to find your way around. Also the Regional website has been updated with a new look and feel, it's still got some work that needs done on it, but it is a great improvement over what we had before already.

**Regional Directories Committee:** needs eyes attached to bodies that are willing to do some service in perfecting our beautiful new meeting directories. All meeting updates need to be in before the first Friday in May, in order to be included in the next printing.

**Regional Hospitals and Institutions** is amending their Guidelines to include "Sponsorship behind the walls". A topic that is being discussed in the RCMs Forum is the funding of Regional H&I and Public Relations, specifically institutions too large in a particular area to be properly funded by the Area, and how much of the burden the Region should take on. Please hold discussions on this in your Group over the next few months so you can give us input on how best we can all further our primary purpose.

# ***Outreach Subcommittee Operational Guidelines***

## **Purpose**

The Outreach Sub-Committee's purpose is to carry the message of Narcotics Anonymous and to foster unity in the Phoenix Area of NA service.

(Boundaries of the Phoenix Area will generally be Phoenix and Scottsdale)

## **Function**

- a. Register Groups with NAWS, Inc.
- b. Provide Support to Groups in the Phoenix Area. Support could be: attending meetings, providing support flyers, and announcing their needs at other meetings.
- c. Assist new Groups in getting started and informing them of available services, and providing a starter packet.
- d. Contact Groups that are not being represented at the Phoenix Area Service Committee (PASC).
- e. Purchase and update meeting lists, and notify web servant in the event of any changes.
- f. To facilitate new GSR orientation at the monthly PASC meeting.
- g. Reaching out and supporting geographically, culturally, or institutionally isolated addicts within the Phoenix Metropolitan Area.
- h. To coordinate and work closely with H&I, PI and Helpline Subcommittees to prevent overlapping of services and increase support among the Sub-Committees.
-  i. To participate in an annual TSLD with the support of the H&I, PI and Helpline Committees.

## **Participation**

All NA members are encouraged to participate in Outreach service.

The Outreach Sub-Committee uses the Consensus Based Decision Making Process as outlined in the PASC Guidelines.

### **Duties of Active Members:**

- Participate in the monthly Outreach Sub-Committee business meeting.
- Attend at least two needy Group meetings monthly.

## **TRUSTED SERVANTS:**

1. Outreach Trusted Servants shall be a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and a Secretary.
2. The Chairperson shall be appointed or elected by the PASC. All other Trusted Servants will be elected by the Outreach Subcommittee.
3. Term of service is for one year or until a successor is elected and their duties begin the following meeting at which they were elected.

4. No Trusted Servant shall hold more than one office at a time and may only serve two consecutive terms in a given position.
5. Any removal of a Trusted Servant will be according to the PASC Guidelines.

### **Responsibilities and Duties:**

#### **CHAIRPERSON:**

1. Prepares an agenda and presides over all Outreach Sub-Committee meetings.
2. Prepares a report and attends the monthly PASC meetings as the voice of the Outreach Sub-Committee.
3. Coordinates and is responsible for all work done by the Outreach Sub-Committee.
4. Maintains communication with all PASC Sub-Committees, WSC Outreach Ad Hoc, Regional Web Servant, and is available to answer any Outreach related questions.
5. Prepares a budget with the Sub-Committee to be presented for approval by the PASC.
6. Must be able to fulfill the duties of any vacant position within the Outreach Sub-Committee.
7. Is elected or removed from service according to PASC Guidelines.

#### **VICE-CHAIRPERSON:**

1. Must have a minimum of one year clean time, six months as an active member of Outreach, a willingness to serve as Chair in following term, and a working knowledge of the 12 Steps, 12 Traditions and 12 Concepts for Service.
2. Attends all Outreach Sub-Committee meetings as well as the PASC meetings.
3. Works with the Chairperson to ensure the smooth running of the Sub-Committee and performs the duties of the Chairperson in case of absence.
4. If necessary, may be removed by a 2/3 vote of the Sub-Committee.

#### **SECRETARY:**

1. Clerical skills to keep an accurate set of records of all Outreach Sub-Committee meetings and learning sessions (topics discussed) as well as maintain archives.
2. Prepare, prior to each meeting, an agenda for the presiding officer.
3. Act as Chairperson when either the Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson is absent, and must be able to complete the duties of same.
4. If necessary, may be removed by a 2/3 vote of the Sub-Committee.

### **Meetings and Miscellaneous :**

- Special meetings will be called as necessary.
- To hold regular monthly Sub-Committee meeting at a time and place that is pre-announced and accessible to the local fellowship.

#### **Annual Workshop at TSLD :**

1. The Outreach Committee shall participate in the annual Trusted Servants Learning Day.
2. The Outreach Committee shall present a workshop for the annual TSLD.
3. One representative from the Outreach Committee shall be at the predetermined facility for the event 1 hour prior to the start of the event.
