CAN – Absent

Policy & Guidelines June 2009 Report to Area

MOTIONS TO INCORPORATE INTO GUIDELINES FROM MAY< 2009 ASC:

Motion #1: To reduce Literature Committee’s Bank account, leaving just \$2,000 in the account. Funds in excess of \$2,000 should be given to Area.

This motion passed and will be incorporated into the Guidelines.

NEW BUSINESS:

A review of the current Guidelines reveals that there is no procedure in place for succession from Alternate Treasurer to Treasurer and RCM 2 to RCM 1, and Alternate Policy to Guidelines Chair. If the Area believes that a procedure needs to be set forth in the Guidelines, it will require a motion inasmuch as it is a Guideline change. Does Area want the Alternate to automatically move into the position without being nominated or elected? If so, suggested language for such a motion could read something like “At the end of the

Treasurer's term, the Alternate Treasurer will automatically become the Treasurer" and the same sort of language for any other position where the alternate or Vice-Chair automatically becomes the Chair. In addition, responsibilities for these positions will also need to be updated via motion. Language along the lines of:

Responsibilities of Alternate Treasurer

- Alternate Treasurer is elected for a two year term
- Alternate Treasurer automatically assumes the Treasurer position at the end of the current Treasurer's term

The current Guidelines do not provide a list of qualifications or responsibilities for the Alternate Policy & Guidelines Chair. Suggest the following:

- Regularly attend ASC meetings
- Actively communicates with P&G Chair
- Update all Area and subcommittee Guidelines as needed

Last month our committee requested an insurance certificate from Mike S. of for the event.

We are looking for additional committee members to serve as vice-chair, refreshments, hospitality, etc. Our committee is enjoying a very cool vibe right now and we would like to build on the momentum we have to take us up to the event.

We have filed (2) new signers with Wells Fargo. The signers are Ida M. (treasurer) and Chuck J. (alt. Treasurer). Next I would suggest that everyone take the time to read the IP SELF SUPPORT & PRINCIPLE AND PRACTICE before voting or making any decisions or suggestions or motions.

One key statement in the IP state "We have seen Individuals relapse over stealing NA money that probably should have been passed on to the next levels of Service" Another, states "Needles Problems such as theft of NA Funds and trusted servants fighting over money, property, and prestige at service meetings result when our service committees hoard NA Funds"

Theft of NA Funds is mentioned twice in one Paragraph. If we passed this money on it cannot be stolen. Not that anyone in our Area could ever steal. At one point our Ares had close to \$18,00 dollars in cash and literature. How does this happen?

Not only committee chairs, treasurers and Committee members but all member should be a little more informed and vigilante. Please look at statements from Subcommittees and Area.

Suggestions

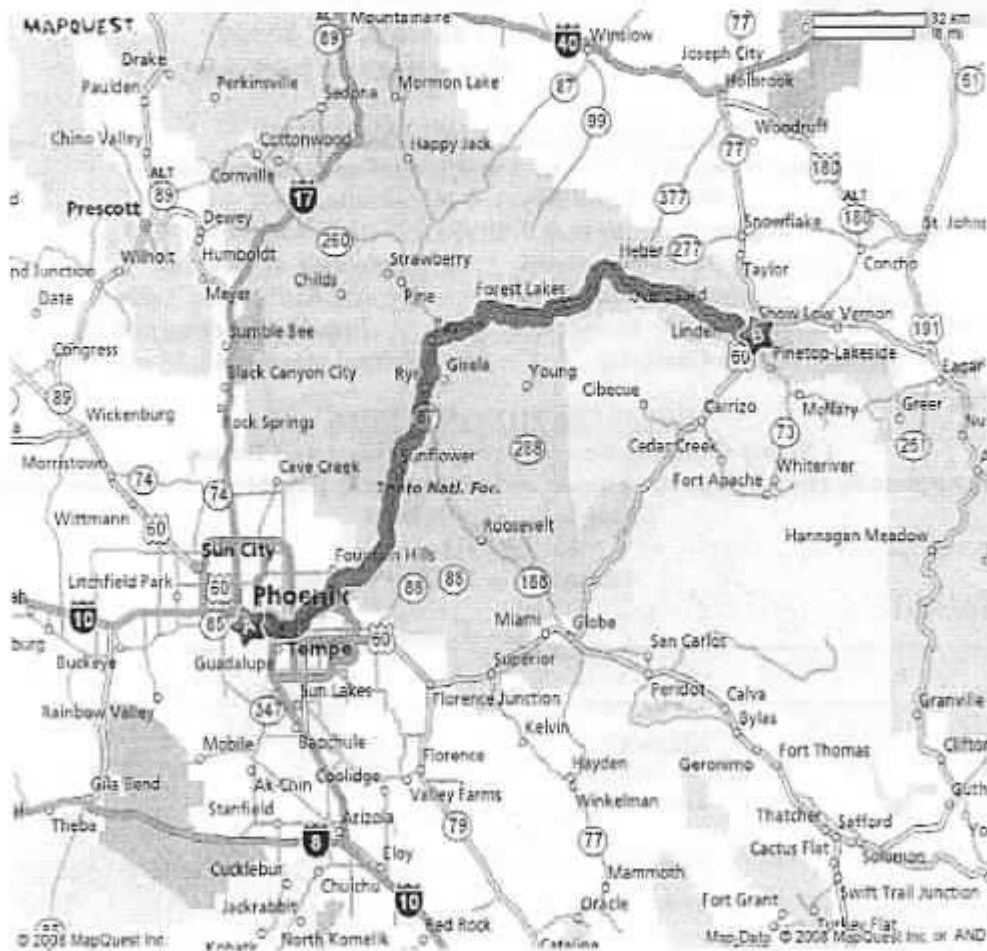

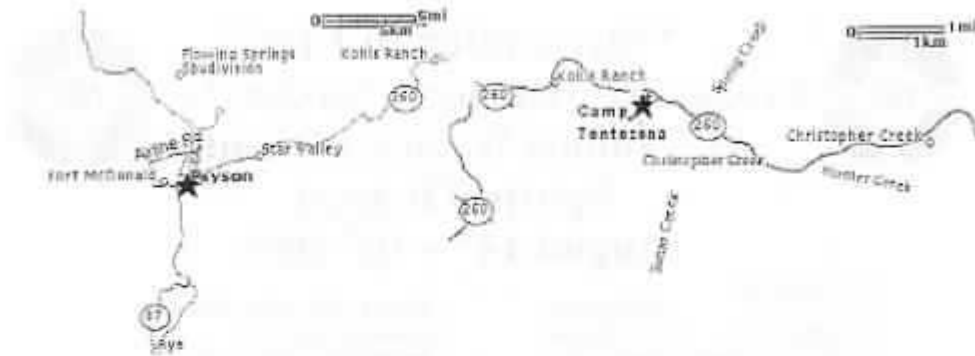

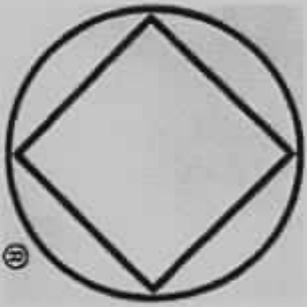
