I have Activities, Public Information, and H&I Subcommittee Guideline Drafts for the Subcommittees to review before submitting for Area Acceptance. Will have Literature and Outreach by next month.

I have the binders for the GSRs that requested them, and an additional 7 copies of Area Guidelines because there has been no update out on the Website.

I am putting together all outstanding Addendums and Attachments for printing and update to website in preparation for new fiscal year(which FYI our Guidelines do not state our fiscal year, so I will make a recommendation today that we do so).

I have two Requests to submit today, one has to do with an update to guidelines to address that there is no documentation of our Fiscal Year in our guidelines, I have offered October to September...I hope this is correct. Request 1-To update WVASC guidelines as follows: B. Operational Expenses-3. (second sentence: At the beginning of each fiscal year; which runs from October to September... The second has to do with the update that was accepted at March Area regarding funds on hold, it is being offered to provide guidance for Treasurer to know when a "Funds on Hold" is needed for subcommittee. Request 2-To update WVASC guidelines as follows: B. Operational Expenses-Add #5, to state: To maintain "Funds on Hold" for subcommittees for any annual budget item which in one month will exceed 25% of Area's Prudent Reserve. For example if there is an expense greater than \$707.00 dollars for one monthly item this year it would have funds on hold. I believe this represents the Areas consensus for establishing funds on hold.

P&P total annual budget is \$195.00. I have used \$22.74 for printing Guidelines. Therefore I have \$172.26 remaining which is 88% of annual budget. My expense for this month will be reported on July's report.

The last committee meeting was on June 9, 2009. The operation is running well, with no problems to report. We have good coverage. We had 5 people total at the last committee meeting including myself, the vice chair and 3 volunteers from the Phoenix Area. Both of our new rollover people showed up! There were no liaisons in attendance; no attendees from East or West Valley areas. There is no clean time requirement to be on the committee.

The Vice chair and I went over Accessline procedures, report writing and billing procedures to make the transition to chair smoother.

The Vice Chair has decided not to run for Chair; she feels she needs another year as Vice Chair.

I have submitted a statement of willingness for RCM and do not intend to run for Helpline Chair again

PI has PSA's starting to air this week; we anticipate a large increase in calls

We did a Helpline workshop in Williams on June 7th for the Peaks Area, it was very successful and well attended.

We will be doing a TSLD for the Phoenix area on July 18th.

We have 71 volunteers on the primary helpline shifts, 4 on Spanish, 4 on rollover and one on "last house on the block" for a total of 80 volunteers. We also have around 90 to 100 volunteers on our 12 step list.

We had 790 regular calls and 39 voicemails in May

Minimum requirements for a shift are 6 months clean, regular attendance at NA meetings, an NA sponsor, working the steps of NA, and commitment to a 6 hour shift once per week. Hello family!

Our committee has dwindled over the last two months, and we really need more support. If you are interested, please contact me at (602) 228-8962 or at tweeter0828@aol.com.

One of the first things our committee did was order the NAWS publication about newsletters. Unfortunately, what little information was there was outdated, so the committee has been focusing on the practicalities of creating a newsletter.

What we've come to realize is that it really only takes two people to put out a newsletter: one to get the information and one to make it readable. Currently, there are two people besides myself, but the person who has been retrieving the information won't be able to continue in that position permanently. Ideally, we'd like to have at least three people, a third to act as editor to give us a better sense of group conscience. Despite that, I believe that it is possible to publish at this time, and we do have copies of a sample edition ready for the GSR's to review.

Distribution: Should the GSR's decide to allow the newsletter to go to print, distribution will be relatively simple. The committee will forward the newsletter to the secretary before Area so that thirty copies can be printed: one for each homegroup, one for each member of the board, and one for each sub-committee chair. The GSR's can then determine if they wish to make copies for their homegroup. We will also have a list so that anyone can receive the newsletter by e-mail when it is ready for print. This will save on print and postage expenses. The estimated cost for printing will be under \$15 per month (approximately \$11) for a four-page edition.

Content: Many of the newsletters we've seen contain editorial pieces, question and answer sections, and clean dates. Although these items can be beneficial, they can also be controversial, and the committee wants to limit the content to just the facts. At this time, we want the newsletter to provide information about available service positions, committee meetings, upcoming events, and meeting changes. We'd like for the newsletter to be a one-stop shop for the basics of what is relevant to our Area. If the newsletter proves to be viable, we may consider adding these other types of articles at a later date with the approval of the GSR's.

Revisions: The committee plans to have a printable edition ready at Area each month. We will request that the body review the edition and submit any changes to the newsletter chair by the end of Area. This will allow the committee to make changes to the newsletter before it is published by e-mail. It will also allow the GSR's to make updates to their copies prior to any additional printing.

If the GSR's decide to go forward with the idea of publishing a newsletter, we'd like to come up with a name other than the WVASC newsletter. We'd like for the GSR's to submit suggestions from their homegroup members as a way to get the word out that a newsletter is in the works and to encourage people to get involved.

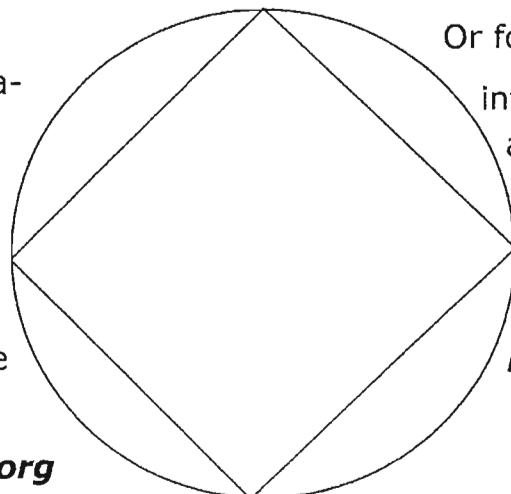

"More Will Be Revealed," the Basic Text tells us - and more has been revealed in the lives of countless addicts around the world in the twenty-five years since our text was published. "Hopeless living problems have become joyously changed. Our disease has been arrested, and now anything is possible," it goes on. Inspiring words, to be sure, but what exactly does that mean for you? This is the question with which we begin our newest literature project, Living Clean - The Journey Continues.

We are recovering in the here and now and the future becomes an exciting journey.

Basic Text

As we live the program we find that dreams really do come true. We also find that we struggle sometimes with real-life problems we may never have expected. Who among us expected to get old? (For that matter, many of us never meant to grow up at all.) How have we dealt with a loved one struggling with addiction? How have we dealt with material or financial success (or ruin)? We could go on and on. You know the particular challenges you've grown through - and we want to hear about them.

The same principles that got us clean continue to be the tools that help us live happy, productive lives as we stay clean through all kinds of life events. But we may struggle sometimes in knowing how to apply those tools, or even in believing that they are still relevant to us.

Our vision for Living Clean - The Journey Continues is that it will be a book for all of us as we grow in recovery. We want to collect our experience as a fellowship in dealing with the very human challenges that make up our lives, and the very particular ways our addiction - and our recovery - lead us to respond and grow.

To realize this vision, we need you. We invite you to share your experience in recovery. Tell us about the times when life threw you a curve - good or bad - and NA gave you the tools to respond to it. Tell us about finding the passion - or being graced with it - to make NA a way of life for you. Tell us about the night the newcomer in your home group said the words that changed your recovery. We want to hear about it.

In the twenty-five years since the Basic Text came out, without question, More Has Been Revealed. Miracles have happened in all our lives. We have grown. And we have learned. Please join us in bringing together our collective experience and wisdom, so we can learn from each other and share what we've learned with the members we haven't met yet.

Chapter 1. Why we are still here

Once we've gotten clean, and we've stayed clean a while, why do we stay in NA? In this chapter we try to answer in terms of the Twelfth Step and the Tenth Chapter: we try to practice these principles in all our affairs, and more is revealed to us as we go forward. But the truth is that recovery isn't always an easy process; there are crises and obstacles we all face, at some time or another. For some of us who are the oldest-timers in our areas, recovery can sometimes feel pretty lonely - even when we're in the middle of the fellowship. Finding the spark that makes recovery an ongoing, rewarding and exciting journey requires an active change in our ideas and attitudes - not just once, but again and again.

Chapter 2. who we are

The first time we say, "I am ... and I am an addict," we begin to change our identity, our understanding of who we are. Our recovery is a constant process of accepting ourselves and changing ourselves, and this chapter seeks to describe some of the ways that we get comfortable with ourselves and the people around us, and begin to let go of what no longer fits. As we allow the principles we practice to become a part of us, we find that we are deeply changed - and truly ourselves.

Chapter 3. What we are – Physical Selves

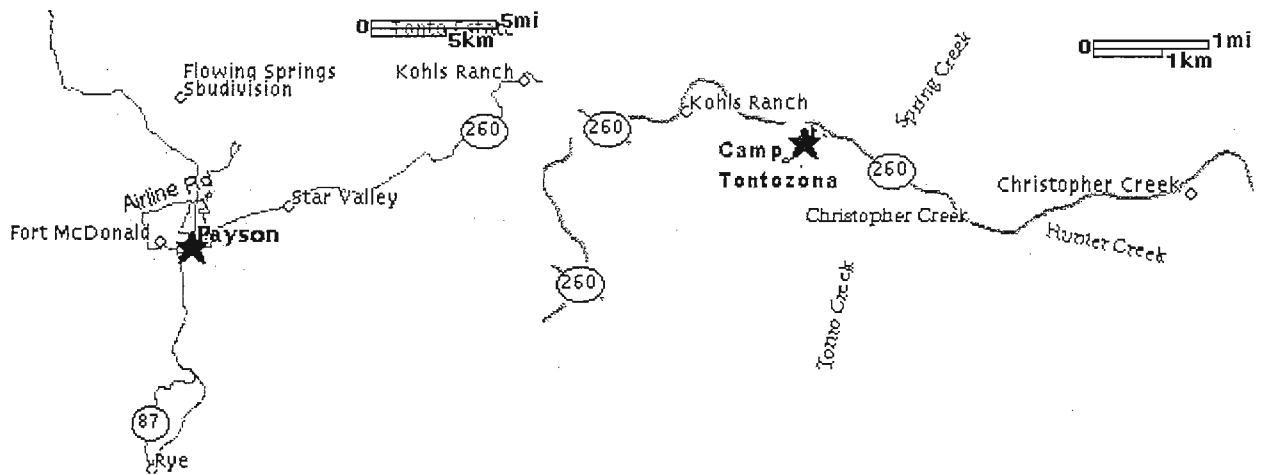

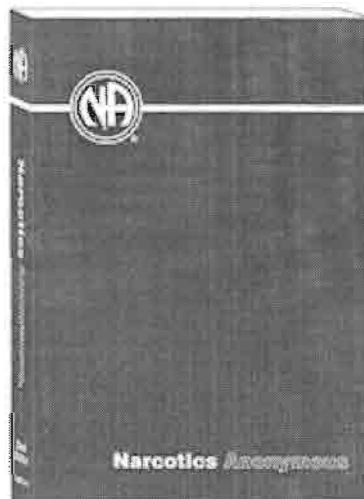
