Sunday, July 19, 2009

Hello family,

This is my final report to the region. I'm sorry but I need to head back to Tucson as soon as possible for some personal matters. Here are some numbers for you on ARCNA 23.

Attendance at the convention was good

- We had approximately 700 people attending the kickoff meeting and 1200 attending the Saturday night speaker meeting. We did not get a count for Sunday morning but it seemed pretty well attended.
- We served 256 dinners and 172 breakfasts.
- The dance was well attended and the DJ kept the dance floor crowded.
- The comedy show was a success. We sold 385 comedy show tickets.
- 511 people registered for the convention
- 200 newcomers were officially welcomed
- Merchandise made approximately \$5000 dollars profit
- The hotel sold 498 room nights at the hotel and we received 9 room night credits on our final bill.

The hotel was very good to us and gave us a great discount on the Hospitality room. They gave us fair prices on the Audio as well as the banner hanging. Our Host Chair, Phyllis, had a great working relationship with the hotel staff and I believe this was very key to our success.

- The carpet was damaged beyond repair in the hospitality suite. We were charged 500 for that damage. We felt that was a very fair charge. The hotel was happy with us overall and suggested that if we do come back, we should have one of the meeting rooms for our Hospitality room and get our food and beverage for that room at a reduced rate. Since we paid for the hospitality suite this year they let us bring food and beverage but they probably will not allow that again in the future.

- The hotel tried hard to accommodate us and we believe they did a great job. They enjoyed our group very much but did tell us that they had several other guests at the hotel complain about the smoking as well as the cursing. They had six guests actually leave the hotel.

Our treasurer, Jacki, turned in a detailed accounting and the audit for the convention took place Saturday, July 18th (yesterday.) We left \$9000 in the bank account for ARCNA 24 seed money, and in addition we are turning over a check to the region in the amount of \$ 16,178.24.

Many people shared their comments, complaints and compliments. Some folks were very loving and some were quite angry when sharing. We encourage everyone to get involved in the future Convention Committees and the guideline reviews. Our committee did follow the guidelines we were given when making decisions and we were prudent in all financial decisions.

Our committee – Dana, Jacki, Phyllis, Christine, Michele, Belinda, Michael, Bernie, John, and Nick – along with all the folks that worked on the sub-committees did an awesome job. I'm grateful for the experience of working with each of them. All the sub-committee chairs are turning over disks to the incoming committee. I think Dana and her committee will do great and all the ARCNA 23 folks will be available to support them.

Because the latest version of any piece of recovery literature reflects the most current group conscience of our fellowship, when NA groups or service committees have the option, we would always encourage them to use the most current version. With that said, groups are free to use whatever version / edition they choose of any NA approved recovery literature in their meetings. And approval of the most current version does not automatically remove the approval status of previous versions.

By direction from the WSC, we at NAWS only produce and distribute the most current version of the Basic Text. Upon the release of the 6th Edition, 1 October, we will no longer sell the 5th Edition. With that said, it may be helpful to consider that NA groups are free to guide their service committees to sell or distribute 5th Editions until their supply is exhausted. There is no mandate that would require them to stop, and of course, to discard these books would seem to be a waste of NA resources.

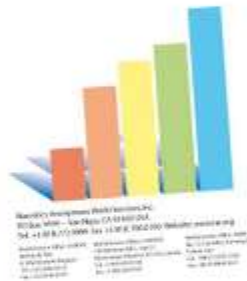

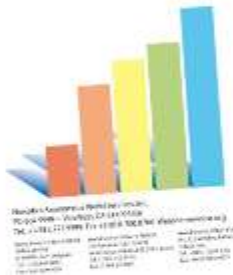
2009 Membership Survey

Every two years we attempt to gather information about our members, and the time to gather that information is now! Some may wonder why we want this information and how we use it. One of the aims of the NAWS Vision Statement is that NA is viewed as a "viable program of recovery." With members from fifty-four countries attending the world convention in Barcelona, and members around the world participating from their homes, we have an opportunity to demonstrate that we are, indeed, a viable and respected recovery community resource. Presenting ourselves in this way helps us offer hope to others that they, too, can recover.

Professionals who work with and refer potential members to twelve-step community resources need evidence that community programs are viable; in other words, that these options will work for their clients. There is an ever-growing trend among those who decide treatment options for addicts to request statistics from anyone presenting themselves as a viable

recovery option. There are other approaches to addiction treatment that have a wealth of statistical information to share. While the nature of our program prevents us from gathering certain types of statistics on our members, this type of anonymous self-reporting survey is ideal for us. Increasingly we are finding that many public relations efforts without these kinds of numbers result in an almost automatic loss of credibility. With these numbers we can satisfy that demand, and NA gains credibility among those most in a position to refer addicts into recovery.

We want you to join us in this survey. In 2007 we had over 13,000 members respond, and we believe we can survey 25,000 members this time. Together, we can let addicts know that we are recovering in Narcotics Anonymous and leading productive, responsible, fulfilling lives.

We are offering members over five months to complete and return the survey either online or by fax or mail, or it can be filled out on-site at WCNA 33 in Barcelona.

We encourage areas and regions to actively encourage their members to participate.
