CHAIR:

Hello EVA,

The following is my inventory of my service commitment as EVASC Chair for the past year.

This past year has been very challenging for me at the area. As the chair I am only there to facilitate the meeting and keep it moving. I am not allowed to give opinions or to make motions. Because I have served at the area for the past 8 years in one capacity or another I am very knowledgeable about NA concepts and our area guidelines. However, I am not a guru and do not want to tell people what to think or what is 'correct'.

The positive aspect of this is I have seen for the first time in a long time GSR's really asking questions and trying to make up their own minds. This is extremely gratifying for me to see the growth. Also, I saw many GSR's continuing to come back month after month, learning and growing with our area. It has been a long time since I have seen such a small amount of turnover in GSR's at area. Was it because of the drama or because they were learning and understanding? I'm not sure, but the end result is positive continued growth.

I give a lot of credit to our RCM's for establishing the GSR 'forum' prior to our area meetings. This in conjunction with actively practicing specific Robert's Rules of Order at area meetings really seemed to help the process, keep us on track, as well as put the power of the meeting back into the hands of the GSR's. The whole point of area is for GSR's to make decisions. Whether these decisions are made immediately or discussed and voted on at home groups, this is the essence of our service structure and the heart of NA.

At the area I have had to keep in mind that I was there as the Chair not as a member. As a member there were many times I wanted to scream. As a chair I cannot influence. I did the best I could at this. The only area I see a need for improvement at this area is in regards to making motions upon recommendation from ad hoc committees. Our budget ad hoc committee put in a tremendous amount of time and energy coming up with suggestions on how we as an area can budget our money better. No motions were ever made in regards to this. The final follow through has not been there. Reports have been read and then just left alone.

It is important to have closure in all areas. Ida giving her written report gave closure to the blues fest issues. What we found was that things weren't as bad as the original audit showed and not as good as the chair reported. It is what it is, truth. Instituting changes to our guidelines and reporting procedures insures these errors cannot be repeated. Subcommittees have instituted changes to help the fund flow of the 7th tradition better serve our primary purpose. As an area we have had many awareness's this year. Awareness without action keeps us in the same place, we just know it sucks!

My final observation is that this area is not knowledgeable about area guidelines. People have been elected to positions they are not qualified for and no waiver to guidelines have been made. I encourage each of you to become more familiar with these guidelines and utilize them. They are the written experiences of those who have walked before you. An itemization of their mistakes, so to speak. When the word 'must' is used in this document, it is because the experiences of others has shown it does not work otherwise.

Overall, I am very grateful for the experiences as your area chair for the past 18 months. I am eternally grateful for the love and support I have received from so many of you.

Here is a list of projects we have in progress and a simple short status report on each.

- Beacon plans are on track for the issue to go out at the end of September.
- Spanish Basic Texts and It Works How and Why books for the libraries were received today from literature and we will start working on placing them in libraries starting with the Guadalupe Branch of the Maricopa County Library District.
- The print media project to place an ad in East Valley newspapers still needs more research. The newspapers want a continuous run for the ad to get the very favorable rate not just 1 month per quarter like we wanted to do.



Dear Kim, Executive Board, Group Service Representatives, and Sub-Committee Chairs,

Thank you for honoring me with the opportunity serve my fellowship in this capacity. It is not a task that I took lightly. This event holds a special place in my heart having served as treasurer for Bluesfest 2, 3, and 4. At that time the treasurer for activities was also the Bluesfest treasurer. Having that experience has given me empathy for treasurers in all capacities. It's a fine line to walk between being firm and being a jackass. On the first hand our primary purpose is always more important than a receipt. On the second hand it's responsible management of funds that further our primary purpose.

This was an audit of financial activity only. I did not review minutes to audit compliance to Bluesfest Guidelines. In an audit financial activity is verified through tests and tracings of revenues. An audit can uncover irregularities with revenues but finding irregularities is not the focus.

The tests I performed were on the two items that brought in the most revenues, t-shirt sales and concession sales. T-shirts were tested by multiplying the number of shirts available (176) by the selling price (\$15). The revenue generated should have been \$2,640. Revenue from t-shirt sales reported in the minutes totaled \$2,261.00. This is a difference of \$379.00 or 17% of t-shirt revenue. I just found out this morning that t-shirts were donated to other committees, however, this is not reported in the minutes. I wanted to test concessions in a similar manner. Beginning ticket numbers were recorded but not ending. I went to the storage unit to examine the remaining ticket rolls and found that the tickets used for purchasing the meal had been used for something else in the mean time and I couldn't verify the numbers with any confidence. Therefore, concessions was unable to be tested. Concession revenue was recorded on petty cash receipts and those receipts tie to what was reported by the ticket chair within \$15.00.

The other method I used was to trace revenues reported in the minutes to the deposits, and to trace checks to receipts. This produced the following: revenues recorded by the

bank exceeded revenues recorded in the minutes by \$105.87. This is 1.2% of the total deposits of \$8,664.49. Expenses not supported by receipts were \$85.91. This is 1.1% of the total expenses of \$7,561.83.

While not the focus of this audit there were some irregularities discovered. I found that on two separate occasions cash funds came in and were not deposited but used to pay cash expenses. The first was in July for \$185 in raffle revenue. It was stated in the August 8th minutes that those funds were used for the event at Summerhaven. The second instance also occurred in July where \$85 in t-shirt money was turned in at the July 12th meeting and \$20 of that was also disbursed at that meeting for flyers. These amounts represent respectively 2%, 1% of total deposits.

It is not my job as auditor to advise this committee as to whether these amounts are acceptable. I will avail this committee of my knowledge of industry averages that variances less than 5% are viewed less critically.

Upon reading the minutes it is my opinion that this committee tried, amid much turmoil, to account for funds in an acceptable manner. This committee hosted many fundraising events that required their attention, and may have attributed to the lack of focus on accounting procedures.

Once again, thank your for this opportunity to be of service.
