**Phoenix Area Service Committee  
Meeting Minutes for August 1, 2009**

The meeting was called to order by the Chair at 12:30 pm with the Serenity Prayer. The Service Prayer, 12 Concepts and the 12 Traditions were read. The GSRs approved last month's Minutes and the current month's Agenda, with the exception that Narathon requested to present their report earlier, and a special election for Activities Chair was added to Old Business. The PASC welcomed new GSRs and Alternate GSRs to the Area. Roll Call was taken and quorum established. Options for Us was reinstated to the GSR Roll, while Just Another NA Meeting and New River Any Addict were removed from the Roll for non-attendance in the last three PASC meetings.

The Executive Committee and Subcommittee Chairs were all present. Announcements at the meeting included upcoming events, with references to flyers and handouts. Reports were presented by the Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, RCM1 and RCM2. All reports were received except for RCM1. There were no requests for open forum.

Old Business was then addressed. A special election for Activities Chair was taken and Jerry was elected. The proposed amendments to the Guidelines to include reference to the TSLD was passed. The secretary will be updating the Guidelines to include the changes and will provide replacement pages at the next PASC. PASC positions remaining open are for Literature, Secretary and Helpline. Reports were presented and provided by all Subcommittees.

An Idea was presented by Primary Purpose to add Home Group Reports back into the PASC Agenda, which idea was unanimously rejected. Statements of Willingness were received from Robin R. for Helpline Chair and Daniel K. for Narathon Chair.

The Literature Chair presented and provided his report, followed by the Treasurer's report and disbursement of funds.

The meeting was closed with the Serenity Prayer.

**Literature Review;** We provided a workshop for Peaks Area during their Unity / Fishing Day. Work on Living Clean the Journey Continues is going well. If you would like a workshop in your area, we are available.

**Public Relations;** We worked with Tucson and Phoenix both on their Trusted Servants Learning Days, both did very well.

**Ideas;** Guidelines changes for H&I on Sponsorship Behind the Walls were accepted, Directories Guidelines were accepted. Holding all Regional Funds until all budgets are met was accepted. We added a Regional Motion to the Conference Agenda Report to restart work on the Traditions Workbook. We decided not to extend the board members term.

Several Areas had Unity Days and Learning Days, all have been getting better support than in previous years. Every area present had a donation to Region this time, some quite large. The Zonal Forum was very productive. A workshop on Living Clean the Journey Continues was held at the forum and I was invited to participate. A lot of work was done and Arizona Region definitely left a positive mark on World Services at the Forum.

One of main tenants of recovery after staying clean, steps, sponsorship is SERVICE, Those who do service stay in NA. They carry the Message of Hope and the Promise of Freedom....look around and you will see those with many years of clean time and recovery still doing service. **HELPLINE REPORT 7/14/09 FINAL**

The last committee meeting was on July 14, 2009. The operation is running well, with no problems to report. We have good coverage. Shifts that could use another volunteer are Wed 12 am to 6 am, Tues and Thurs 6 am to noon and Mon and Wed noon to 6 pm. We had 3 people total at the committee meeting including myself, the vice chair and 1 volunteers from the Phoenix Area. There were no liaisons in attendance; no attendees from East or West Valley areas. There is no clean time requirement to be on the committee. \$Fr

The Helpline Chair position remains open

PI had PSA's starting to air in June; we did not see a significant increase in calls. I understand sometimes it takes a little while for them to be effective

We did ~~doing~~ a TSLD for the Phoenix area on July 18<sup>th</sup> at Crossroads at 1845 E Ocotillo from 1 to 6 pm; it was a huge success although we did not have the time to play jeopardy ☺.

We have 71 volunteers on the primary helpline shifts, 4 on Spanish, 4 on rollover and one on "last house on the block" for a total of 80 volunteers. We also have around 90 to 100 volunteers on our 12 step list.

We had 700 regular calls and 50 voicemails in June
