RCM I Report  
December 13, 2009

Greetings,

First let us clear up a couple of house keeping items: 1) Region's position on strobe lights at dances is this, "now that we know, it is a liability". Which means, that NA, as a whole can be held liable for an incident wherein strobe lights cause an adverse reaction to an addict. Please keep this in mind as you plan your activities. 2) All meeting list changes shall be submitted to the RCM I, preferably at our Area meetings. The RCM I is the designated point of contact with the Regional Meeting List Directory committee. Changes submitted to the Directory committee by any one other than the RCM I will not be implemented until approved by the RCM I. Changes are due on the last day of even numbered months, February, April, June, August, October and December. Our cut off this month is extended to January due to the holidays. Questions?

Attached to this month's minutes will be a Meeting Format Code which Bethany has asked us to review at home group level. These are suggested format codes and compatible with WSO. As we are such a unique bunch of addicts here in Arizona, these codes can be amended as input from the areas is received. I am passing around a form for you to provide the name of your meeting, the appropriate code and any changes that you need in the next directory.

The CAR report is available and has been emailed to all GSR's by our esteemed secretary, Alice G. If additional reports need to be printed for the home groups, please bring up the discussion at this month's meeting. **REMEMBER**, the next Regional Assembly will be held in Casa Grande, on January 9, 2010 at the United Methodist Church in "The Fellowship Hall", 1515 N. Trekell Road, Casa Grande, AZ 85122. The assembly begins at 8:00am and is scheduled to run to 5:00pm. Please have your home groups review the CAR report and come prepared to discuss. Better yet, bring your home group with you. South Central puts on quite a spread for lunch and no one should miss it.

Regional Report:

At the RCM forum there has been discussion regarding the region purchasing literature and all areas then purchasing from Region as opposed to areas ordering directly from the WSO. The purpose of this is to obtain a larger discount. The issue at hand is that the minimum purchase is \$60,000.00 which must be paid upfront. Our Regional Literature Review Chair has been gathering information on this issue. In addition, there has been research into ordering our literature from the Northern California Region, as of last regional meeting we did not have figures in on that option.

Reports from the WSLD were very favorable and our RDA, Ken F. provided a copy of the workshop CD's to each area. Said CD's were entrusted to our RCMII, Mike and more will be revealed in his report. Per Greg W., next year's WSLD will probably be held in Northern California and he highly suggests that we send our H&I and PR chairs.

Jeff, our PR chair will be contacting area PR/PI Chairs regarding PSAs.

The workshop held at our last Regional Assembly was the largest workshop held so far on the current literature product, "Living Clean, The Journey Continues". Furthermore, the 2 chapters that we worked on, Risky Behavior (in recovery) and Sex and Sexuality do not have a lot of material submitted so our input will most likely be utilized as the framework for further input. And, if you weren't there, you missed it! If the East Valley is interested in holding further workshops, please let the RCM's know. We can help facilitate this and it really is kinda fun.

From Joey F, our H&I Chair, our Regional H&I Committee is filling a request from the La Paz County Jail for Basic Texts, the number of texts was not provided. There has been a request from Perryville Prison that NA consider forming a committee of some sort to meet addicts as the gate as they are released. Our H&I Chair will be discussing this with his committee as well as passing this information to the Phone Line Committee to see if this is perhaps something the 12 Step Call List would be interested in participating in. Joey also attended the WSLD and found it to be a wealth of information regarding such issues as Sponsorship behind the Walls and H&I in general.

Dana G., our lovely ARCNA Chair reports that some of the left over ARCNA XXII merchandise will be brought to the January Regional Meeting to be distributed to the Areas. The balance of the merchandise will be held and sold at various activities for fund raising throughout the year. Said merchandise brought in \$122.00 at the Bluesfest. Three of those planned events are spaghetti dinners in Tucson and Phoenix and the Sports Day, where I have no doubt, East Valley will once again emerge as the victorious Volleyball team. Right Jack?

The theme chosen for ARCNA XXIII is "24 Hours 24 Years Just For Today", the logo is circled around a globe holding hands. The logo was not previewed at the Regional Meeting and the colors were to be finalized the week after Region met, so I have no further information on that. Pre-registration is \$25.00, and pre-registrants will be provided with dog tags, which the committee is hoping to have engraved with your clean date, perhaps at the convention. After April 15 registration will be \$35.00, dinners \$40, breakfasts \$20.00.

Treasurer's short report, beginning balance \$12,138.30, Income \$2,663.09, disbursements \$2,966.92, ending balance \$11,953.27. Dana is currently working on the budget with realistic numbers based on the spread sheet that came out last month.

Creating space on the printed directory is part of the ongoing mission of producing a directory that contains as much accurate information as possible that is also legible. Currently, there is room for a maximum of 10 characters for the codes. We propose that one way we can accomplish both "readability" and standardizing our format codes is to get each home group's input.

**YOUR ASSISTANCE NEEDED:** We believe that the home group is the best judge of which code(s) accurately identifies their format. That being stated, please present this legend to your GSR's and ask if they would review and compare their format codes with this legend and return the changes to the DC via the usual method agreed upon by your ASC's.

Bear in mind that we are attempting to recover space on the printed directory using 1 or 2 characters per format and it is entirely possible that our legend needs editing as well. **Regional Activities Chair- 5 years clean, (Chris or a Chris?),**

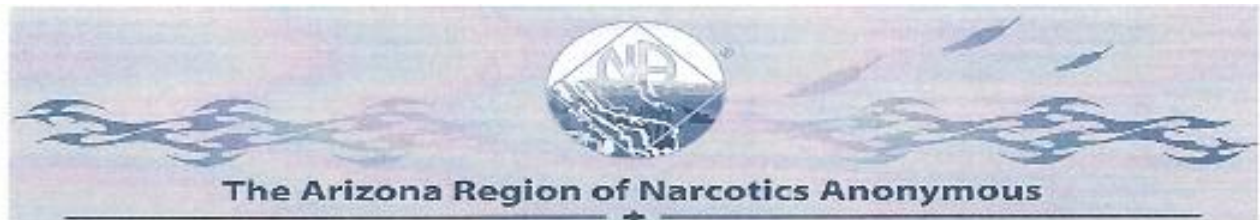

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## **OUTREACH:**

East Valley Area Outreach Committee 12/13/09

Hello Family, my name is Tricia I am an addict.  
Last month Outreach supported the following meetings:

It's Time (Men's)  
Five-Minute Basis of Not Using  
Highway to Serenity

We were scheduled to carpool to the Circle of Hope, however; only one member showed up for that, and unfortunately we were not able to go. Next time I will be sure to get firm commitments for outreaches such as this.

We are doing things a little bit different this month. We are outreaching with these goals in mind: support home groups in need, as often as possible and get more people involved. To do this, at our committee meeting, each member shared what meeting they will support in the month of December, and how they intend on supporting it. Ex: Invite other addicts to go with them, announce it at other meetings, create a flyer, offer assistance with setting up/tearing down the meeting... etc. I believe this will give some flexibility to the committee members and the outreaches could be stronger. Our committee knows that we outreach in members of two or more, and if they are not able to find other addicts to attend with them... they will support anonymously.

We've written some guidelines for NA Bedside. They are as follows:

### NA Bedside Guidelines

- a) 1) Chairperson/meeting facilitator will have 6+ months clean, with chairperson experience, and be responsible for calling ahead to find out hospital rules + visiting hours. Chairperson will bring literature for the opening readings and be responsible for maintaining an atmosphere of peace and serenity while the meeting is administered. 2) Volunteers will follow the rules of the hospital and respect the sound privacy of other patients in the addict's room. 3) Volunteers will visit in sets of at-least two; (as per outreach guidelines) but no more than five visitors at any one given time. 4) The list/numbers will be published to subcommittees only and not given to the addict requesting the service.
- b) If an addict is on "medical bed rest" *NA Bedside* may go to a residence to provide a meeting. When visiting an addict's home, all precautions will be taken into account (this is not a "12 step call"... and NA Bedside will not enter into dangerous situations). Examples of precautions to consider: addict is actively using or has roommates who are active in addiction, or addict has a contagious illness, etc.

Last week Outreach presented the guidelines and a phone list to the phone line committee. So far, Phoenix Outreach and the phone line love the idea and addicts are lining up to volunteer.

Finally, EVA Outreach is always open to suggestions and friendly amendments. The guidelines + phone list will be updated as needed, and thus far, the idea has been very successful.

ADDENDUM 'A': reflects removing 'and Executive Committee' from the voting procedures. Per the motion passed at August, 2009 EVASC

D. Voting

1. Voting members are all active GSRs present. The Chair may vote to break a tie.

A. Motions must be passed with a majority (51%) of eligible voting members casting ballots. A majority is "more than half" of the votes cast by persons entitled to vote, excluding abstentions. Only a majority of those voting is required. Abstentions do not affect the vote.

B. Guideline amendments must be passed by 2/3rds vote of eligible voting members casting ballots. Two-thirds vote means two-thirds of the votes cast excluding abstentions. Only two-thirds of those voting are required. Abstentions do not affect the vote.

2. Only active GSRs vote on money matters and at officer elections (see GSR requirements).

A. A simple majority of voting GSRs is required to carry.

3. When a voting issue goes back to home groups, only GSRs are allowed to vote on guideline and non-guideline issues.

Addendum 'B' Section C item 3 reads:

The Area must maintain a prudent reserve in order to meet its needs. Prudent reserve shall be set at a minimum of 2 months, and not more than 2 months worth of operating expenses (777.40)at this time for the following expenses: Rent-public storage-PO Box-Phone line -Secretary Expense-Meeting-list- and Hotline cards.

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## Phone Line

### Helpline Report 20091205

Hey everyone,

What follows is the agenda I sent out for the helpline committee meeting this coming week. The only thing I have to add is that we have a member that has volunteered her studio for the voice mail message recording. I should probably summarize one of the agenda items below - a discussion about doubling our hunt group capacity to allow us to offer shorter shifts. The idea is that we might get more volunteers with 3 hour shifts since our current 6 hour shifts tend to either conflict with work or class schedules, or the sleep required to work a full time job or pull a full time load in school. This would require a second Accessline "SmartOffice", and that would be an additional \$30 per area (there's more detail below). I'd like to get a straw poll from the area to see if there's any objection to pursuing this further. We still haven't seen the West Valley liaison, so I may be taking the same idea there if the committee is in favor.

And now for the numbers - no surprises there. The access line bill for November is \$90.67, and the Qwest bill received in November was \$58.42. So we're at \$49.70 per area, which is pretty much the same as usual. We received 640 calls in the month of November, of which, 35 were voice mails.

This coming Tuesday, December 8th, is our last meeting in the East Valley for a while. We're meeting at Coffee Rush at 7PM, which is at Baseline and Gilbert in Gilbert. The meeting in January will be in the West Valley, and I'll keep you posted on the location. It's currently looking like the Next coffee shop at 59th Ave and Utopia, or Maui Wowie coffee shop at 59th Ave and Peoria.

I think Angela finished calling all the numbers on the 12 step list, and I called most of the numbers on the volunteer list. I know I missed a couple of you, but that probably means you have multiple shifts and there's not much doubt that you're doing OK. I did drop a few numbers from the hunt groups that were disconnected or no longer receiving inbound calls, as well as some numbers for folks that now have a work conflict. That means we have quite a few openings. Specifically Monday 6AM to noon, Wednesday noon to 6PM, Thursday 6AM to noon, and Friday noon to 6PM. I'm also considering adding additional volunteers on the weekend, but that's something we can talk about at the meeting. As far as the 12 step list goes, we probably need to talk about that as well before sharing it with everyone on Google Docs. Looks like it shrank - a lot.

Speaking of the 12 step list, the East Valley Outreach Subcommittee has a new program to visit addicts in the hospital that can't get to a meeting. I think it's called NA Bedside, but I'm hoping to learn more about it Thursday night when Tricia tells us about it at the Phoenix Outreach meeting (Park Central Starbucks at 7PM). I've received a couple of calls that sound like they fit this description, and I'm sure a few of you have too. They want to extend the program valley wide. Sounds like a great idea.

Last month, we talked about adding additional roll-over shifts since it's hard to find volunteers available for a three or four day, 24 hour per day commitment. The process of adding the additional hunt groups made it clear that we've maxed out our hunt group capabilities on Accessline. We now have seven roll-over hunt groups, but Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday don't time-out to the 3rd level hunt-group known as "The Last House on the Block" - the way we traditionally have. Instead, they're ordered hunt groups that call me last, then go to voice mail. I talked with both customer support and sales at Accessline about how to overcome the limitations, and it would apparently take an additional "SmartOffice". This means we'd double our capability, but we'd have to find a way to route calls from the Quest number to two different Accessline numbers, depending on what day of the week it was. I'm thinking about a silent menu on the existing Accessline that routes to the other number based on the calendar. I'm not sure if we'll get signal degradation since that means a call into the 480 number would be forwarded to the initial Accessline number, then forwarded to the second Accessline number, then forwarded to the volunteer. Seems like a lot of forwarding unless some kind of route optimization is used, and I haven't found a really knowledgeable person at Access line to talk with yet that really knows how their transfers work. I'm already hearing some echo, so my guess is that this would only make it worse. Another alternative is writing an outbound telephony script to modify the remote forwarding on the Quest line twice a week. That would have been a no-brainer with the PCs and old NuVoice hardware I got rid of in my yard sale last week, but it might be possible to do it with some other mechanism. I've got a couple of ideas, and I'm definitely open to suggestions.

If we do find a way to pull this off, and we get all three areas to OK the additional \$33/area expense, that would allow us to implement twice as many hunt groups. We could go to 3 hour shifts instead of the current 6 hour shifts if we so desired. I think some potential volunteers just can't fit our 6 hour blocks into their schedules. This may be a way to get more people involved, and it would give us a separate system to facilitate major mods and testing, but it would also double the administration load. Still, I think it's worth talking about, if only to convince ourselves that the "bang for the buck" isn't there.

We still need to record a couple of menu greetings for voice mail (one in English and one in Spanish) that let's a caller know that they'll need to unblock their phone if they want a call back. I'm also considering saying

something about giving us permission if they want us to leave a message on their voice mail. I'm always reluctant to leave a message since you never know who has access and the caller may not want their family to know that they've reached out for help. Thoughts? Anyone have a good mic and decent sound card in a silent environment so we can create the right audio files? I think my PC is a little too noisy (nine fans), and I'm not sure about the built-in sound on my daughters Gateway laptops. Regardless, we need a microphone. CoolEdit or GoldWave should be able to generate the correct format, and I'm pretty sure I have copies somewhere. I think I also have a copy of Cakewalk, but that's sort of overkill (it's not going to take a 24 track mixer).

Anyway, we have plenty to talk about and tons of stuff to do for anyone that wants to get involved. Even those that don't have the 6 month clean time requirement, as long as they can use a computer. Got a sponsee that needs to do some service and does audio recording? Bring them along. Or give them my phone number...
