**Phoenix Area Service Committee  
Meeting Minutes for December 4, 2009**

The meeting was called to order by the Chair at 12:30 pm with the Serenity Prayer. The Service Prayer, 12 Concepts and the 12 Traditions were read. The GSRs approved last month's Minutes and the current month's Agenda, with a correction to note that RCM2 was present last month in the Roll Call. The PASC welcomed new GSRs and Alternate GSRs to the Area. Roll Call was taken and quorum established. Announcements at the meeting included upcoming events, with references to flyers and handouts.

The Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, Vice Treasurer, Secretary, RCM1, RCM2, and Subcommittee Chairs were present and presented their reports. The H&I Chair left early, but an interim report was prepared by a committee member and read to the PASC. The H&I report was received by email by the Secretary and is attached. There were no requests for open forum.

There was no Old Business to be addressed. Four new Ideas were presented, as follows: (1) by RCM2 for the Phoenix ASC Meeting to be moved to the third Saturday in January 2010 (withdrawn); (2) by Northside at Noon for Abstention vote to be taken out of 2/3 quorum (referred to ad hoc committee); (3) End of the Road – when voting is needed to reach a group consensus, abstention votes are a vote with the majority (referred to ad hoc committee); and (4) by Helpline – to Add additional access line “smart office” (accepted).

The Literature Chair presented his report, followed by the Treasurer's report and disbursement of funds.

The meeting was closed with the Serenity Prayer.

Dear Fellow Members,

The big news is the Conference Agenda Report. It is now out and available, both on line and hard copy. Our Area has chosen to purchase a hard copy for each participating GSR or in their absence GSR/Alt. so every Group in our Area may have the opportunity to form an informed Group Conscience on each of the issues to be decided in this conference cycle. It is each GSR's responsibility to read and study the CAR all the way through BEFORE the Regional Assembly in January. When you read it, it is ok to write notes and questions down in the CAR itself. This will help when you come to the Regional Assembly in January. Don't worry if you don't understand it all, that is what the assembly helps us with. After the Assembly it will be time to plan your Group Conscience meeting with your Group to go over what you have learned and present each motion in the CAR for discussion and decision as to how your Group will be voting at the Regional Assembly in March. You may choose to have just one long meeting or several meetings. Some Groups will try to just give you their "vote of confidence", please remind them that it's not possible to vote someone's conscience if you've never discussed it. If they still insist, you know that at least you did your job.

The Regional Assembly for the Conference Agenda Report Workshop will be held January 9th at 1515 N Trell Rd, Casa Grande Az. 85112 (United Methodist Church) for info or directions call, Jeff D. The Regional Assembly for the Conference Agenda Report Vote will be held March 20th at 655 E University Dr Mesa Az. 85203 (City of Grace Church) for info or directions call, Cliff S.

During the RCM forum we discussed some of the pros and cons of our literature purchasing and distribution in the Region. Currently we are spending around \$64,000. annually in Arizona Region. This discussion led into further discussion on a centralized distribution system, possibly an office. All at the table however want to take this discussion slowly. Our budget is still being discussed the treasurer is still gathering information for us on how accrual budgeting would work for us.

17 Regional Committee Members and all Administrative and Subcommittees were represented except Activities (currently open) and History of Arizona NA.

Chairperson; Working with Treasurer on budgeting. Please bring flyers for all Areas, and RCMs be sure and take them all so our events don't go unsupported.

Regional Delegate; Attended Verde Valleys Learning Day, and there was a lot of discussion about people on controversial medication (methadone) holding key Area Service Positions. Did not put in a motion to add the Traditions Workbook to the World work list, because another Region is submitting a similar motion.

Regional Delegate Alternate; The Regional Assembly in Show Low went well and was well attended. Our Workshop on Living Clean: The Journey Continues was discussed at the Zonal Forum and other RDs liked the format. I will be attending the Zonal Forum in San Diego, we will be going over the motions in the CAR.

ARCNA; We selected our logo, budgets have been approved, and have selected our taping company. Pre-registration will be \$25. Banquet \$40. Breakfast \$22. We will be having a spaghetti dinner in Phoenix and Tucson, and a sports day in March.

Board of Directors; There is a position open for a Board member (min. 10 yrs. clean required) This position will be elected at The Regional Assembly in Casa Grande. We are currently negotiating contracts with The Conquistador for our convention site. Our new Insurance Coordinator is doing well.

Directories; We are looking at the codes for meetings and are moving towards a unified one for the whole Region that conforms with worlds.

Hospitals and Institutions; We received two requests for literature, Lake Havasu asked for six Basic Texts. We had one prison request an additional meeting.

Literature Review; Show Low workshop went very well, approx. 40 in attendance several people with multiple decades. we had great input into the Living Clean Project. I am continuing to submit materials to the World discussion group as well.

Public Relations; Attended WSLD it went well, we purchased the CDs of all the workshops and distributed a copy to each Area. (I will be duplicating copies for H&I and PI).

Web Servant; Things are going like usual.

East Valley; Bluesfest did well \$1774.14 in excess of budget. Everyone liked where it was held. We ran out of Meeting Directories and are increasing our order to 2700. Our donation is \$1326.

Lake Havasu; H&I is going over the Dos and Don'ts with all committee members, we're doing well in the jails. We have a Donation of \$18.78.

Navapache; Holbrook meetings are doing well, Show Low meetings are having low attendance. We are requesting The Festival of Recovery again. Donating \$50.

Peaks; Thanks for all of your support with this years Surrender under the Stars Campout. We are returning the \$250. seed money and Donating \$100.

South Central; Donating \$40. for Meeting Directories.

Southeastern; We're reviewing our Guidelines, changed Public Information to Public Relations. We are under our prudent reserve. Donating \$100.

South West; MACNA did well 300 paid registrations. We learned a lot and will do better on the next one. We've had a drop in meeting attendance.



# Helpline Report 20091205

Hey everyone,

What follows is the agenda I sent out for the helpline committee meeting this coming week. The only thing I have to add is that we have a member that has volunteered her studio for the voice mail message recording. I should probably summarize one of the agenda items below - a discussion about doubling our hunt group capacity to allow us to offer shorter shifts. The idea is that we might get more volunteers with 3 hour shifts since our current 6 hour shifts tend to either conflict with work or class schedules, or the sleep required to work a full time job or pull a full time load in school. This would require a second Accessline "SmartOffice", and that would be an additional \$30 per area (there's more detail below). I'd like to get a straw poll from the area to see if there's any objection to pursuing this further. We still haven't seen the West Valley liaison, so I may be taking the same idea there if the committee is in favor.

And now for the numbers - no surprises there. The access line bill for November is \$90.67, and the Qwest bill received in November was \$58.42. So we're at \$49.70 per area, which is pretty much the same as usual. We received 640 calls in the month of November, of which, 35 were voice mails.

This coming Tuesday, December 8th, is our last meeting in the East Valley for a while. We're meeting at Coffee Rush at 7PM, which is at Baseline and Gilbert in Gilbert. The meeting in January will be in the West Valley, and I'll keep you posted on the location. It's currently looking like the Next coffee shop at 59th Ave and Utopia, or Maui Wowie coffee shop at 59th Ave and Peoria.

I think Angela finished calling all the numbers on the 12 step list, and I called most of the numbers on the volunteer list. I know I missed a couple of you, but that probably means you have multiple shifts and there's not much doubt that you're doing OK. I did drop a few numbers from the hunt groups that were disconnected or no longer receiving inbound calls, as well as some numbers for folks that now have a work conflict. That means we have quite a few openings. Specifically Monday 6AM to noon, Wednesday noon to 6PM, Thursday 6AM to noon, and Friday noon to 6PM. I'm also considering adding additional volunteers on the weekend, but that's something we can talk about at the meeting. As far as the 12 step list goes, we probably need to talk about that as well before sharing it with everyone on Google Docs. Looks like it shrank - a lot.

Speaking of the 12 step list, the East Valley Outreach Subcommittee has a new program to visit addicts in the hospital that can't get to a meeting. I think it's called NA Bedside, but I'm hoping to learn more about it Thursday night when Tricia tells us about it at the Phoenix Outreach meeting (Park Central Starbucks at 7PM). I've received a couple of calls that sound like they fit this description, and I'm sure a few of you have too. They want to extend the program valley wide. Sounds like a great idea.

Last month, we talked about adding additional roll-over shifts since it's hard to find volunteers available for a three or four day, 24 hour per day commitment. The process of adding the additional hunt groups made it clear that we've maxed out our hunt group capabilities on Accessline. We now have seven roll-over hunt groups, but Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday don't time-out to the 3rd level hunt-group known as "The Last House on the Block" - the way we traditionally have. Instead, they're ordered hunt groups that call me last, then go to voice mail. I talked with both customer support and sales at Accessline about how to overcome the limitations, and it would apparently take an

additional "SmartOffice". This means we'd double our capability, but we'd have to find a way to route calls from the Quest number to two different Accessline numbers, depending on what day of the week it was. I'm thinking about a silent menu on the existing Accessline that routes to the other number based on the calendar. I'm not sure if we'll get signal degradation since that means a call into the 480 number would be forwarded to the initial Accessline number, then forwarded to the second Accessline number, then forwarded to the volunteer. Seems like a lot of forwarding unless some kind of route optimization is used, and I haven't found a really knowledgeable person at Access line to talk with yet that really knows how their transfers work. I'm already hearing some echo, so my guess is that this would only make it worse. Another alternative is writing an outbound telephony script to modify the remote forwarding on the Quest line twice a week. That would have been a no-brainer with the PCs and old NuVoice hardware I got rid of in my yard sale last week, but it might be possible to do it with some other mechanism. I've got a couple of ideas, and I'm definitely open to suggestions.

If we do find a way to pull this off, and we get all three areas to OK the additional \$33/area expense, that would allow us to implement twice as many hunt groups. We could go to 3 hour shifts instead of the current 6 hour shifts if we so desired. I think some potential volunteers just can't fit our 6 hour blocks into their schedules. This may be a way to get more people involved, and it would give us a separate system to facilitate major mods and testing, but it would also double the administration load. Still, I think it's worth talking about, if only to convince ourselves that the "bang for the buck" isn't there.

We still need to record a couple of menu greetings for voice mail (one in English and one in Spanish) that let's a caller know that they'll need to unblock their phone if they want a call back. I'm also considering saying something about giving us permission if they want us to leave a message on their voice mail. I'm always reluctant to leave a message since you never know who has access and the caller may not want their family to know that they've reached out for help. Thoughts? Anyone have a good mic and decent sound card in a silent environment so we can create the right audio files? I think my PC is a little too noisy (nine fans), and I'm not sure about the built-in sound on my daughters Gateway laptops. Regardless, we need a microphone. CoolEdit or GoldWave should be able to generate the correct format, and I'm pretty sure I have copies somewhere. I think I also have a copy of Cakewalk, but that's sort of overkill (it's not going to take a 24 track mixer).

Anyway, we have plenty to talk about and tons of stuff to do for anyone that wants to get involved. Even those that don't have the 6 month clean time requirement, as long as they can use a computer. Got a sponsee that needs to do some service and does audio recording? Bring them along. Or give them my phone number...
