Public Information Subcommittee Report - Feb 6, 2010

I am very happy to report that we had a great turn out at our last PI meeting, we have some enthusiastic members and I am hopeful that we will be able to accomplish our goals.

I'd like to introduce Rose W, our new PI Vice Chair!

Our initial focus is on reaching the addiction treatment providers in our area. We are working closely with H&I to organize literature including books, posters, and IP racks in inpatient treatment centers.

From there we have many good ideas about posters in laundromats, TASC, outpatient addiction treatment centers, professionals in the medical community who are likely to treat a large number of addicts, and more.

We will systematically approach our mission to spread the message that **WE DO RECOVER!**

We are in the process of designing a professional looking PI poster, I expect to have one to show you at the next PASC meeting in February.

We decided to only fund the New Times ad \$800 per year and devote more of our financial resources to bringing Basic Texts to inpatient treatment centers. This is an overlapping effort with H&I. People new in treatment are commonly given an AA Big Book (that has been donated by AA) as a basis for beginning their recovery program. We decided at our meeting that NA needs to offer this same chance to addicts in new recovery. We want addiction treatment providers to become more familiar with NA, and providing Basic Texts is a good way to accomplish this.

This month Outreach visited "Hope Spot NA" which they meet Thurs 8:30pm at St Luke in the Small Conference Room. This meetings has been existing for about 5 to 6 months. They don't have a GSR nor many home group members. I spoke with the addict who help start this meeting. I asked her if they are struggling, and as I suggested she agreed they need support. It's a God-stick meetings of quotes from our basic text. So I told her we'd be back to help support and witness this meeting. They are aware of Area and somebody look to join the Phoenix Area. Again they need all the support they can get. I am considering join this Home group myself. For I am in need and searching for a new one myself.

Finally I would like to inform the Area we have a date set for the TSLD. Outreach has joined with Activities and we are sharing expense for the day. The TSLD will be held April 17th which is the Saturday Activities would have a dance. The location will be at the Church on Glenrosa. We are working hard to plan you a fun eventful

TSLD. Some of the things we are doing are, Workshops
by the Sub-Committees and a Tradition Workshop.

Helpline 20100203

Hey everyone,

Things are working pretty well on the Helpline. We had 627 calls in January with 32 voicemails. The Qwest bill was \$58.55 and the Accessline bill was \$90.59 for a total of \$149.14 or \$49.71 per area. No rent since we didn't reserve the room at our meeting location (*Next Coffee Co.* 19420 N. 59th Avenue, Glendale), and the same will be true for our upcoming meeting on February 9th. Not a big deal since there's plenty of space for us to meet in the common area, but we do have the room reserved for March. That's probably a good thing since we'll need to prepare for the TSLD scheduled for April 17th. We're intend to do a skit that represents the variety of helpline calls covered in the training, so we'll need to work through the script and practice.

We have a few new volunteers that joined us in January, and a couple in queue for February. I'm getting the impression from some folks I talk to that we'll have a much easier time getting new volunteers if we can transition to 3 hour shifts. This is still contingent someone (me in all likelihood) getting to WVA on 2/20 and submitting an idea for a second "Smartoffice". The budget submitted today based on previous Helpline budget has been modified to accommodate an increase in the Accessline charges accordingly. As stated previously, this boils down to an extra \$30 per area per month.

The 12th step list is being called, and most of the calls have resulted in unanswered voicemails. We have been getting some updates on availability and location or additional information like whether they get text messages, what their email address is, or whether the volunteer wants to participate in NA Bedside or Bridge calls. A fairly large percentage of numbers are no longer valid or the volunteer is no longer available. I'm also working on 12th step call volunteer suggestions. This is becoming more critical since we're expanding the scope of the 12th step list, and there are some "do's and dont's" that need to be communicated. By the way, we've had a request from ADOC to hook inmates in recovery up with recovery on the outside when they're released. I've been calling this a "bridge program" since that's what it has been called by another fellowship, but it's basically just volunteers willing to talk to them and/or get them to their first meeting and another column on our 12th step list.

I think we need to do some testing on notifications and roll-over, and we should be talking about things like DR and contingency plans. There's still plenty to do for those that are technically savy even if they can't commit to shift. Come on out to 59th Ave and Utopia on the 9th!

PASC AD HOC COMMITTEE
ABSTENTIONS IN THE CONSENSUS BASED DECISION MAKING PROCESS
February 6, 2010

This Ad Hoc Committee has put together this report regarding abstentions in the voting portion of the consensus based decision making model in the PASC guidelines as directed by the PASC body. As an extension of the body, the first thing we agreed upon was the goal. The goal, simply stated, is unity, unity of purpose, to consider the greater good be served and truly activate the 1st tradition where "Our common welfare comes first, personal recovery depends on NA unity." It is in this spirit this report is written.

The idea of the abstention comes from parliamentary procedure, and more specifically for us, from Robert's Rules of Order. It's definition from that book is "An abstention is not considered a vote. As a result it is not counted in the final tally. Members should invoke their right to abstain on an issue that might present a potential conflict, such as an issue they have a personal interest in." Now, at the Area service level our decision to abstain, when issues come to a vote, is not invoked because of conflict of interest but usually because of indecision, lack of information or simply not knowing the conscience of our homegroup. The PASC model for consensus based decision making (CBDM), is a hybrid of both a consensus process and in the event a consensus cannot be reached we go to a vote and operate under Robert's Rules. This is not unusual. This committee has examined approximately 20 sets of NA guidelines from around the country. What we have found is NA areas, regions and world service bodies adopt a process that works for them. Hybrid models they all are, but they work and when they stop working they change.

This committee would like to present two options for our groups to consider:

1. Work with the existing model. If a consensus cannot be reached and there is a vote, and there are abstentions, call for discussion again. In that discussion the facilitator should find out the reason for the abstention and what they need in order to vote. For example, if a person needs more information, the body should attempt to provide the GSR with enough information to make the decision for a vote. If after that there can still be no resolve it goes to homegroups. The GSR should ask his group for the vote to carry. The issue should then be brought back as part of old business per item #8 of our operational guidelines.
2. Work with the existing model but remove a call for abstentions. Adopt the term "Stand Aside Position", which more accurately defines the action of the member. The definition of a stand aside position is a voting member who does not wish to carry either a yes or no vote and does not wish to interfere with the process or decisions of the PASC body. The 'Stand Aside Position' would not be counted in the quorum as they would be called for before the quorum is counted. It would follow that

if there were 25% or more standing aside there should be further discussion on the idea as we do not want the few to make a decision for the many.

Our recommendation is to adopt Option 2. This committee would also be willing to present these guideline changes in idea form if this body so desires.

Some of the other things we have discussed as a part of our process and providing as information to the PASC are:

- 1. Reminding ourselves that the point of consensus is to get to solution, not win.**
- 2. A pure form of consensus could work if members were willing to invest the time work the issues out and educate themselves on the process.**
- 3. A lot of the success of the consensus making decision process depends on the leadership of the facilitator. The body needs to give latitude to them so that they have the freedom to guide us to solutions.**
- 4. Abstentions may not have a place at all in consensus because the point is to give voice to all members. An abstention implies no opinion or place.**
- 5. It is okay to concede to the majority but get on the record as having an objection. This is clearly stated in the operational guidelines. It is part of the consensus process because we cannot always agree.**
- 6. Whatever we decide, we should have a part of the new GSR orientation dedicated to how the decision making process works so that new GSR's know what the options are and be prepared to act on those options.**
