Greetings everyone,

First let me say what an honor and a privileged it is to serve as your regional delegate. Ken F. and I have just returned from 9 days of total and complete immersion in Narcotics Anonymous Service. It is one of those experiences that cannot be explained it has to be experienced. It is an event that touches the entire world, and I am grateful to have been given the opportunity to be a part of it. Hopefully we have brought back some of that experience for you to use in your areas and in your home groups.

The biggest topic for the next cycle will be our service system. We are looking at making changes (possible very drastic changes) to how our service structure works. It will affect how we are represented at the WSC. Some possibilities include zonal representation which means that the regions will send delegates to the Zonal Forums and the Zonal Forums will elect 2 members to the WSC, other ideas include Geo Political representation, there are many other possibilities and one of them will be to not change a thing and leave the structure alone. This will be the hot topic for the next cycle and we will be doing workshops on this at future NA events.

If you receive any publications from NAWS keep an eye out on the next few issues. NAWS will be cleaning up the database to help cut the cost associated with the mailing of publications. If you would like to continue to receive the paper version you will have to opt in in-order to continue to receive it. Better still, sign up for the digital version as it has more stuff in it than the paper version, including links to content you won't find in the paper version. This past conference cycle the NA Way has cost more than \$250,000 dollars, so please subscribe to the digital copy if you can.

If you want to know what's going on at NAWS, then log into the discussion boards. There you will find discussions on all the projects that are currently underway, and many other general discussions, on many NA related topics. If you have never logged into the discussion area, please do, we need your input and your experience. You will find a link to the discussion area, and links too many other useful areas, at the end of this report.

One of the big topics that NAWS hasn't looked at is "The Internet" and all that it implies. We have had no guidelines to go by. An example would be Facebook and the ability of members to place photographs of NA events, there by breaking the anonymity of many members, who never gave their permission to the person who posted them. Many people who think that their page is private and can only be seen by those they choose are in fact letting anyone view them because they do not know how to use the privacy controls on Facebook. This is just one small example and is only the tip of the iceberg of a much larger and growing problem with "Social Networking Sites".

NAWS has a disaster plan in place to insure the survival of NA should there be a catastrophic event. It is a five point plan with 1 being everything is just wonderful to 5 which would be closing the

doors and run NA out of someone's house (which we have done before and we can do it again if we have to). Currently we are somewhere between 2 and 3, which means that we have not been able to meet all the requests from around the world, fewer World Wide Workshops, cleanup the NAWS database, do more with less is becoming more and more of a theme @ NAWS.

The bottom line is this, the fellowship has been growing at an exponential rate, and we now have over 58,000 meetings a week. In 2008 it was around 50,000 meetings a week. So we are growing very rapidly, just one problem, seventh tradition has fallen to record lows and continues to fall. Since we are a fellowship that survives on literature sales and not on seventh tradition, this leaves us in a very bad place, rock and a hard place comes to mind. Saying NO to a request for help from someone somewhere in the world is not what we want to do. We need to look very closely at how our money is spent and what we spend it on. The reality of all this is that it takes money to help carry the message, and without people to carry it the money is useless, we have the people but are lacking the money to accomplish all the goals mentioned in our vision statements.

The approval draft of the living clean project will be sent out in April of 2011 for approval at WSC 2012. If you haven't attended a "Living Clean – The Journey Continues" workshop, then you are missing an opportunity to help write our literature, the beautiful thing about that is that we still do. Many other fellowships either have very old literature or they have just used another fellowship's literature.

For those who are familiar with "The Area Planning Tool" we have created "The Area Planning Tool Lite" version which we feel will help in the process of doing the inventory, and strategic planning.

The CD that was passed out contains almost everything from the WSC 2010. What you won't find are the movies and many of the PowerPoint presentations that contain photos of members of NA. No sooner than the information was placed on the FTP site it appeared on many other places with the user name and the pass word to access it. Everyone was told about not doing that, and someone did. We will be showing these videos and Power Points at events over the next two year cycle, please don't ask for copies of them, we will not be able to give them to you. The CD also includes all the available issues of The NA Way and NAWS News, among other stuff...

NAWS is in the process of creating a Google Map (a layer to the techies out there) and has been changing meeting addresses into longitude & latitude, I will have more info on this later...

Since Ken F and I have computer backgrounds, we will be getting the text file upload to NAWS going again, we have made a commitment to the directory committee to work on this project. We will also be working closely with Lori "The Purple Database Queen" from NAWS to get this project finished.

Some Statistics:

There are 216 people seated on the floor of this WSC.

Of the 114 seated regions, there are 111 RDs present. Ecuador, Le Nordet, and Nepal are not in attendance.

Of the 111 RDs from seated regions, there are 67 from the US, 5 Canadian, 39 from outside the US and Canada. In addition, there are 2 invited non-seated/non-voting delegates from Denmark and Lithuania.

We have 86 Alternate Delegates from seated regions attending, 66 from the US, 5 from Canada, and 15 from outside of the US or Canada. There is one invited alternate from Denmark, a non-seated region.

We are also made up of 154 men and 62 women.

Key tags are available in 45 languages and we are in 131 countries
