Open Forum

July 18, 2010

As a proud, and at most times outspoken, member of this fellowship I would like to express my deepest concerns about this year's ARCNA event. I found the respect that this fellowship gave to the hotel and to the other people registered during our event left a lot to be desired. I know if I was part of the management I would not ask us to come back. I feel very strongly that has members of Narcotics Anonymous it is our right to respect the laws of the city and state where we hold our events. This was not done this year. I, and others, noticed there were people smoking by the doors, under the over hangings, near windows and within 20 feet of the building. Arizona and City of Mesa laws were broken.

Members of NA were throwing their cigarette butts on the ground, putting them out in the flower beds and in the grass instead of butt cans or has my sponsor calls it field dressing them. Friday night just before the main speaker meeting started there were a large amount of people out at the smoking area and about 15 minutes before this meeting started a lot of us NA members went inside and left our trash right where it was. It took another addict and me two 33 gallon trash bags and 20 minutes to pick this mess up. Come on two 33 gallon trash bags. This also happened Saturday around the pool area. With towels being left where they were and the trash left all over the place. Again it took a couple of us to clean this mess up. I do not know how or what any of us teach our sponsee's today and I do not really care. I know my sponsor and his and his and his taught me and I teach mine that I am responsible for my actions and that means PICKING UP after myself. When I saw this MESS Friday night I was utterly disgusted. It did not end there either. The example we as Narcotics Anonymous members showed that weekend left a lot to be desired. I am just as much to blame for this as everyone else who said nothing to the people that we saw doing this.

I do not know if ARCNA or this body can make any changes to what happened but I feel that we, as a fellowship, need to apologize to the hotel and the staff for our actions. I hope this brings to light something and that from now on we will all pay attention to our surroundings. I know I will.

The good news is that lots of exciting work is happening at PASC

Not so good news is that, due to the 4th of July holiday business meeting schedule, we were unable to establish quorum so no business could proceed.

We were scheduled to have elections; they were postponed due to lack of quorum.

We have statements of willingness for all positions except Vice Chair, Secretary, Literature and Outreach. The current Literature and Outreach Chairs have expressed a willingness to carry on until new Chairs may be found.

Outreach can always use support, but have been doing well. They have attended approximately 7 meetings since my last report. Went to 3 meetings where one had become a CMA meeting, the other 2 had folded

Helpline has been fielding around 600 calls per month and 45 voicemails. The helpline serves the Greater Phoenix Metropolitan Area; it is based at PASC but responsible to all three Phoenix Metro Areas. Shifts are available. They are investigating shortening the shifts from 6 to 3 hours to make it more accessible to all. There is added expense with software

PI is struggling with lack of support but doing an outstanding job. There is an idea on the floor to change the name from PI to PR. They have distributed a lot of Basic Texts to facilities. They also have a new poster and some really slick business cards for distribution. They are partnering with Sunnyslope Task Force, and John C Lincoln Hospital to coordinate them to contact us to arrange a 12 step call to take an addict to their first meeting. They continue to nurture and develop their relationship with the Phoenix PD. We are also on [Twitter@PhoenixAzNA](https://twitter.com/PhoenixAzNA)

H&I is doing well, we had a panel coordinator step down and another immediately step up to take their place. Critical Care at the AZ State Hospital has asked for a meeting as well as Guiding Star; Elba house that had requested a meeting last month has been covered

Narathon is doing well and has new merchandise to vend. Bumper stickers, wrist bracelets, and a "No Matter What" tshirt

I hear tell that the Activities Sedona Campout was successful once again
