Phoenix Area

I was not able to make the regional meeting in September because of a family matter. I have however been keeping up with regional and world events. First I would like to report on the task you gave me at our last Area service meeting. You asked me to do some research on the possibility of the Phoenix area using the Non profit status of the Arizona Region for postal mailings, namely our minutes that must be mailed out. I contacted the CFO of the Board. He informed me that this has been proposed before but never followed through on because of the overall benefits not weighing more than the cost and effort. Some of the issues at hand would be buying a machine, all postage would have a USPS non profit stamp on them. I did not research the cost of the machine but the CFO said it could run us \$250-500. The machine would have to be made available to all who needed it in the Arizona region. This means it would have to be transported to other areas. These are just some of the issues. I also contacted the post office.

First we must qualify by way of application. There are limits that we must commit to mail every year as well, approximately 440 pcs. The online calculator shows that it would cost approximately .72 per pound.

NA World Services is looking for volunteers for WCNA Workgroup for WCNA-34. This group will solicit and coordinate the over 1000 volunteers needed for the event. The workgroups also offers ideas, helps to communicate about the event and assists in creating a local hospitality functions. There is a 10 year clean time requirement. I have already responded and would like to get a group together to go to the 11 required meetings in San Diego starting in February. If you are interested you can contact me or email Eileen@na.org.

There is also a new literature survey available on line. Please encourage all your homegroup members to access it and speak up about our literature needs. It can be completed by mail as well.

Hello Phoenix Area Service Body,

Last month the Help Line took on two new shift volunteers. There is still a need for a vice chair, a secretary, 24 hour rollovers for Monday through Friday, and a volunteer for the Monday 6am-noon shift.

We are in the process of purchasing an additional SmartOffice. When that is finalized Robin, another volunteer, and I will begin building the new SmartOffice for three hour shifts.

I will have a booth for the Help Line at BluesFest to “attract” 12th Step volunteers.

I was contacted by the West Valley PR Chair to research getting a toll free number. My understanding is he met with the other PI/PR subcommittees in the Phoenix Metro Area and they discussed changing the Tri-Area Help Line number to a toll free number. The idea is it will be easier for addicts to reach NA and increase unity among the three areas. In order to speed up the decision making process, I’m asking the GSRs to please discuss the idea with your home groups this month while I gather pertinent information. The group’s consent and/or concerns can be addressed in November at the same time I present all the information.

Our next subcommittee meeting will be Tuesday October 12th at 7pm in Glendale at Next Coffee Co: 19420 N. 59th Avenue, intersection of Utopia. You do not have to attend a subcommittee meeting to be a phone shift volunteer but must meet the 6 month clean time requirement. 24 hour rollovers do not need to attend either but must have at least 6 months clean and Help Line volunteer experience. Public Information Subcommittee Report - September 2010

On a positive

note, the three areas (Phoenix, EV and WV) chairs met with a few other members to discuss the following:

- ✓ The possibility of radio spots. We would budget \$1,000 from each area (EV is awaiting budget approval) and would run a series of radio spots on various venue stations, including at least one Spanish-speaking station. The committee members who attended from the areas are excited about the prospect of these spots and should have more information and a proposed cost next month. We did agree that the "message" of the spot would have to be approved by all three Chairs and their committees. We will also contact the Pinal County region (I forget its name) to determine their commitment; however, we do not expect any financial commitment from them.
- ✓ We discussed the possibility of a toll-free number for the entire state. ^{in the area} Lamont of the WV is going to check this out more. I do not know the history of our phone number and if we discussed this in the past. I was in Flagstaff last week and when I called Verizon 411 for Narcotics Anonymous, I was referred to a clearinghouse for drug use and they gave me a number for NA that was not operational. I called back and the second number they gave me was for a plumbing company. Hm.

We continue to struggle to develop a PI committee of more than a couple of members. At this month's meeting, only two attended, me and another member, who is moving out of state this month. We continue to focus on attracting and recruiting new members. Nonetheless, here is what we are working on.

- ✓ The PR Committee Chair met with JC Lincoln Hospital, as we have reported before. They are agreeable to a post-hospital visit/stay referral to NA where we would work directly with the person rather than have them call the phone line. This could include taking them to a meeting or at least reaching out immediately or bedside when people may be amenable to intervention. We also met with the charge nurse for the neonatal unit and she took us to meet the neonatal nurses, who were thrilled about the idea. They told me CPS was at bedside with an addict mother right at the moment and they didn't know where to refer people. We believe once I can cut through the hospital red tape, this will work. Again, we will have to coordinate with the phone line to do so.
- ✓ Jeff T. and another committee member, Dave, agreed to meet with Maricopa County Probation in Sunnyslope. They can also provide direct referrals to NA and an addict can actually help them attend their first meetings. This must be coordinated with the phone line's 12th Step list members at a future date, hopefully by early fall.
- ✓ I continue to attend various Sunnyslope community events, making an announcement and taking literature. Please watch your local paper and if you see events where we could set up a booth, let me know. My # is
- ✓ I met with one of the top public relations officers with the Phoenix Police to try to get us in front of the PD and see if they would be willing to carry our cards in their cruisers. We provided NA info packets and cards for the five liaisons to each precinct. She *still* has not gotten back to me. I will go directly to the Chief of Police if she doesn't respond to see if we can get something going.

Our next meeting is on last Sunday of the month, which is ^{Sat Nov 6 - 11 am St Lukes Hospital} ~~Sunday, October 31~~, at 5pm at Paradise Bakery on the southwest corner of 12th St & Glendale. It would be really great to see you there! We really need your support! We can't do this alone.

I am also considering moving the PR meeting to Saturday before area to see if we can get better participation.

PASC Action ___ Guideline Change ___ BOD Action ___

Decision Making Process

1. There will be one GSR permitted to carry their home group's consensus.
2. Any PASC participant present is eligible to discuss.
3. The PASC Guidelines are the primary procedural source in conducting the Area's business.
4. A stand aside position may be taken by any voting member who does not wish to carry a yes or no vote or does not wish to participate in the process or decisions of the PASC body regarding the issue at hand. This position can be taken in the voting portion of the consensus model.

New Business Requests

An Idea or Request is the method by which actions are formalized by the PASC members. The following are guidelines for their use:

Operational Guidelines

1. This body operates on a consensus based decision-making process (see CBDM model following).
2. Any Idea or Request must be submitted to the secretary in writing before the Consensus Based Decision Making Process can begin.
3. As a spiritual body we try to reach all decisions by consensus; we believe that a loving God's will is expressed through our group conscience (2"d tradition). In the event we cannot reach consensus, a decision will be reached using a 2/3 majority vote to reach our decisions.
4. One of the reasons we try to achieve consensus is it insures that we follow our 9th concept, "All elements of our service structure has the responsibility to carefully consider all view points in their decision making process." By carefully discussing and respectfully listening to all points of view we try to make sure this occurs at the committee meetings. The reason all GSRs are allowed to come to a consensus on many decisions is the 701 concept which states, "All members of a service body bear substantial responsibility for that body's decision and should be allowed to fully participate in its decision-making process."
5. All sub-committees are encouraged to operate with the same process.
6. All committee ideas/request except elections will first be considered using consensus based decisions for the committee's purposes. The process for consensus-based decision-making allows for points of view to be heard and fairly considered within the committee. At this point the chair can recognize PASC participants if needed.
7. If at the end of discussion the committee has not reached decision, those dissented from the majority will be given the opportunity to state the reason for their dissent if they choose. If their rationale does not persuade the majority to change their view, the dissenting GSR(s) may be asked if they can support the majority view, even though they themselves do not agree with it. In matters where the dissenters cannot assent to the majority, a decision will be reached using a 2/3 majority vote. Before voting the Chairperson will call for those taking a stand aside position. These representatives will not be counted in the quorum. If those taking a stand aside position exceed 25% of the voting members the vote will go back to discussion.
8. When an idea or request is being discussed in new business and time in the PASC meeting ends, that subject will be brought up in old business at the next PASC meeting.
9. Any member of the PASC may submit an idea/request to the floor.
10. GSRs may address request or ideas brought to the floor.
11. Participants may be recognized by the chair. Idea or request is made with reason. Supported by Traditions or Concepts

12. Once an idea has been referred to the groups by this body, the idea must be allowed to be resolved by PASC Guidelines input from the groups and cannot be withdrawn by the maker.
