## January 16<sup>th</sup> 2011 Regional Secretary's Report

Wow, what an eventful month for me, as I am sure you all know by now I had some serious technical issues with the Minutes in December. I apologize I did not get them done sooner; I have some medical issues that occasionally slow me down. I sent out the first batch on Saturday 12/11/10 in 2 parts as the file size limit on my yahoo account is 25MG and the 48 pages of Minutes far exceeded that. Apparently some of you got the 2<sup>nd</sup> part and no one but me got the 1<sup>st</sup> part (I get a copy of everything I send to the Main e-mail account.), I then tried to send them back out on Sunday and again on Monday and I started getting failure messages for exceeding file size. At that point I finished the postal mailings and started to re-scan the Minutes into two smaller size files. This would be when my scanner/printer crashed (for the third time in 5 days), so onto phase 2 of my exiting adventure in service. I spoke with a couple of people (asked for help) and determined the fastest way was to go up the street and scan them at Kinko's, where I make the copies. I did this on Tuesday 12/14/10 and hopefully they are all received by now. I know there will probably be several people with two 2<sup>nd</sup> parts of the Minutes and the scanner at Kinko's not being in my control and charging me \$.30 a minute, there are some unavoidable errors in the final scans. One of those errors being the fact that I left the first page of the Minutes (the Agenda for January) in my broken scanner at home, So I sent it out in a third or fourth or fifth e-mail as a Word doc. My financials are understandably just as confusing. I spent \$82.29 on copies, \$15.80 on mailing, \$11.83 and \$1.50 on scanning for a grand total of ~~\$111.42~~. I have receipts for all and hope the necessity of my having to buy a new scanner/printer will lead to less confusion (and less time and stress) for future Minutes.

Greetings family,

The East Valley Area has now officially included a GSR Forum prior to the ASC meeting. Our area meeting will now begin at 2pm on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of every month. The last GSR forum contained some rousing discussion.

Our H&I committee will begin taking meetings into Winners, which is a women's facility. All other meetings are currently covered and we have 3 people badged for the Canyon State facility which is a juvenile boys facility.

Our PR committee continues to try to get back into Community Bridges and had a meeting with the facility on January 11 in conjunction with H&I. As the 11<sup>th</sup> was after the area meeting I do not yet have an update on the outcome. We have 6 Spanish Basic Texts now circulating in the Maricopa County library system. The new PSA's were played at the ASC and as of this date East Valley has not received a request for funds to air any of them and our PR Chair's phone messages and emails have gone unanswered. It is our understanding that these are being aired at the expense of Phoenix and the West Valley and expect that more will be revealed.

Also, H&I and PR will be meeting to research joining the respective committees or at the very least not duplicating efforts.

Blues Fest has requested that you take back the flyers regarding this year's logo contest.

Our area has been below prudent since we voted to change our prudent reserve to 1 month's expenses and we have been looking for ways to reduce costs. We have now decided not to put the \$100 month aside to pay for our H&I and PI Chairs to attend WSLD for a period of 6 months, at which time we will reassess our finances. In addition, we will no longer mail our minutes out. We did vote to pay for 1/3 of all the phone line expenses as it was brought to our attention that we have not been billed for a full 1/3; and, to continue to pay for our meeting lists even when we are under prudent reserve. Alas, the treasurer did not cut me a check for meeting lists, yet I have every confidence that said check will be mailed to the regional post office box.

South Central Area RCM Report

Greetings from the South Central Area.

Over the last two months and really the last couple of years, our area has been growing in a very small way and struggling with some of the same issues.

Our outreach committee was attempting to support a meeting in Ajo which just didn't have enough consistent local support to survive. We are continuing to support a meeting in Globe and our outreach chair reports ~~so~~ <sup>some</sup> joint efforts in that direction with East Valley Outreach.

Our activities committee is planning a bingo event for the 19<sup>th</sup> of February, there is an event on the 29<sup>th</sup> of February, and of course, the monthly Eatin' Meetin' at the RUTS home group in Casa Grande on the 29<sup>th</sup> of January. We have no flyers at this point for any of these events.

Our finances have taken a pretty dramatic hit. Our largest group and steadiest contributor is on about month five of difficulty and next to no donation, and we all know the economic story nationwide. One of the fallouts is H&I support. As we have repeated again and again, our H&I needs are far greater than our resources. Our subcommittees continue to hold money and do fundraising separate of the Area revenue stream, thus dividing their efforts. We'd seek some experience on this front.

I've been asked, and I know Tom has already asked in H&I today, to request assistance of both manpower and financial nature. Due to the lack of warm bodies to go into the myriad facilities we have in our Area, we need to literature to at least get some NA message in. I've been asked to bring a literature request for 50 basic texts so we can make some effort in that vein. I'll be submitting a motion for that. We would like next year's H&I budget to include greater support in that direction.

OK I guess that's plenty for now; we are grateful to carry the message in the South Central Area.

speakers from around the AREA as well as one from the east coast to share their experience, involvement and what H&I meant to them. We also had informational discussions and a round table discussion/Q &A which there was a lot of participation and insight.. 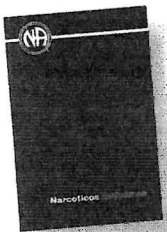

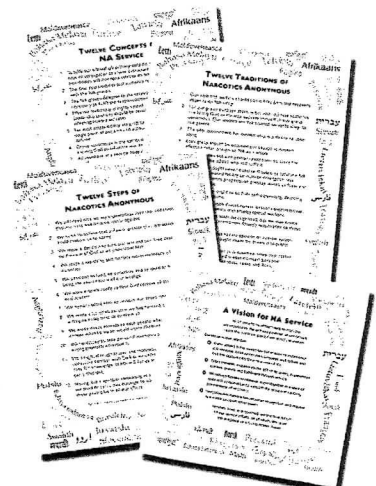
