SERVICE SYSTEM UPDATE

Summary of the WB Service System Discussions January 2011

This is only meant to be a summary and an effort to help in your discussions about this project. A more complete revision to the proposals will be coming to you soon. We want to thank you again for your efforts in having these ideas discussed locally and ask that you let us know how we can help to support your efforts.

A Summary of the WB's Service System Discussions January 2011

We spent much of our January meeting holding discussions about the next stage of the Service System workgroup. We spent two full days in discussions with the Service System workgroup members and staff and will be formulating a new, revised proposal in the upcoming weeks. We expect to have this next draft to you by March. We hope it will be the basis of further discussion that will help us to frame what proposals will be contained in the 2012 *Conference Agenda Report*.

Much of our discussions were about how components of the system work as well as how they work together based on being Purpose Driven, Group-focused, Defined by Geographic Boundaries, Flexible, and Collaborative. Our discussions will be reflected in the revisions of the proposals, but this eblast should give you an overview of our ideas in the meantime. We are also working on developing material about processes that we believe can help us all be more effective in working toward our vision.

So many of you have held and are planning to hold workshops and discussions about these proposals that we wanted to let you know as soon as we could about our discussions of your input and the direction of our ideas for revision of the proposals. We reviewed the more-than-100 pages of input you submitted, and we thank each of you for helping to shape the proposals and move this work forward.

Foundational Principles—Collaborative

"Collaborative" will be added to the list of foundational principles. There are now five foundational principles: collaborative, group-focused, purpose driven, flexible, and geographically defined.

Successful service provision depends on all the elements of a service system working together toward our common primary purpose. This means that structure, processes, people, and resources must work together, and that components of the system must cooperate both "vertically" and "horizontally" throughout the structure.

Group Support

A service body devoted most centrally to meeting groups' needs will continue to be a central part of the proposals. We do not feel it is necessary, or helpful, at this time to recommend a particular option—linear or two-track—for local services, but will try to outline the different options and provide reasons why a community might prefer one or the other.

Things that will happen at GSU meetings:

- Informal training and mentoring
- Discussion of group issues, group sharing, no business
- Welcoming and outreach to new groups and members
- Orientation and introduction to service (recovery literature & service literature, traditions, concepts, etc.)
- Informal information sharing (e.g., upcoming events, LSU activities, new merchandise, NAWS issues topics)
- In some instances or circumstances, GSUs may be involved in some service delivery (e.g., putting up flyers in the community or supporting a local H&I meeting).

GSU attendance is open: Groups send a delegate and any interested member can come.

Local Services

We have spent quite a lot of time at our last two board meetings discussing how we believe an LSU actually works. These discussions will result in better clarification of our vision of this component of the system rather than any real change to the structural model already offered.

Revisions to the proposals will describe the local service unit as comprised of a local service board and a regular (three to four times a year) planning conference, including an annual planning assembly event.

Local Service Board:

- Includes chair, vice chair, treasurer, secretary, delegate(s), and service coordinators for essential services
- Meets monthly or as needed
- Oversees workgroups and routine services; coordinates the planning assemblies; develops budget and strategic plan to be reviewed, input, and approved by the planning conference; maintains external relationships; sends a delegate to the next level of service.

Planning Conference

- Consists of group and/or GSU delegates, LSB members, project coordinators, and interested members
- Meets three to four times a year

- Starts with an annual assembly (see below) to gather input and set planning goals. Planning conferences follow the stages of the planning cycle. They are used to prioritize, approve workgroups and budget created by the LSB, monitor and report, change direction as necessary, evaluate service delivery, and elect the board.
- There may also be training sessions and a session for interfacing with the intermediate, state/national, and world services levels (like a *CAR* workshop).
- As throughout the system, decisions will be made by consensus where possible.

Annual Assembly

- The annual assembly is a planning event that gathers input from everyone to set planning priorities (like our environmental scan).
- It consists of everyone who attends the quarterly/triannual planning conference.. All interested members are encouraged to attend.

Intermediate Bodies

Intermediate bodies are those service bodies created to meet needs of density or distance or language. In essence, they are intended to span a gap between one level of service and the next in places where the NA community is densely populated, such as New York, or where the distances are great, such as Texas, or in places where the population is bilingual, such as Montreal. They are "permanent" and they are within the delegation stream. While it may be tempting to rename an existing service body an "intermediate body" to minimize the impact of restructuring, that's not the spirit of the proposals. A clear need must be established to create an intermediate body.

As already stated in the proposal, they are not created to provide shared services outside of the delegation stream. We acknowledge the need to explain how shared services will function in the new system and are asking that some of you who have experience with shared services share your experience with us.

State/Nation/Province

The board needs to further discuss what we mean by "state," "nation," and "province." In the revisions to the proposals we will more explicitly acknowledge that the terms "state" and "province" are more flexible than simply "US states, Canadian provinces, and everyone else is a nation." Some type of "state" approach may be applicable to countries such as Brazil, Russia, Mexico, and India with many meeting and multiple regions. Conversely, it may make sense to combine states in places like New England. The issue needs further discussion.

WSC Seating

We will be recommending a seating model based on state/national/province service bodies. We recognize that this model may have a shelf life due to the size of the WSC, and we will continue to be interested in exploring something like a "zonal" seating model (with the understanding that the "zones" as we now know them might need to be revamped to make such a model workable). At this time, however, state/nation/province seating seems most practical.

Further seating criteria need to be developed, including but not limited to better defining "state" and "nation" (see above).

Zonal Forums

Zonal forums have only really been addressed in the proposals insofar as they do or don't factor into seating. Their role in the system needs to be better defined in the proposals.

Processes

Ultimately, we would like to see concrete material on processes, like the ideas on planning discussed above in the "Local Services" section. However, given our perennial struggles with leadership and communication processes, we just don't feel like we are there yet. We will be offering fundamental principles related to leadership, communication, and planning (and possibly decision-making, and what we are currently calling information management and issue management) in the next drafts of proposals.

Issues for Further Discussion

The following items need further clarification and discussion. This is by no means an exhaustive list. These are simply the items that came up in our recent discussions that we didn't have time to fully address:

- Fund flow, including how the GSU is funded
- Literature distribution—where will groups buy their literature?
- Legal issues: corporations, insurance, RSOs
- Synching planning cycles throughout the system
- Who creates intermediate bodies?
- Who determines LSU boundaries?
- How do shared services (committees) work?
- The state/nation issue—e.g., Brazil, Mexico, India, Russia
- Further seating criteria

This process must be completed to be considered for WSC 2012 nominations. If you are considered for a World Services position you may be contacted again for additional information.

Again, if you are interested in being considered for world services efforts, you must complete this update process by 31 August 2011. HUMAN RESOURCE PANEL ANNOUNCEMENT

14 March 2011

Greetings to all Regional Service Committees, Zonal Forums, and the World Board. As stated in *A Guide to World Services in NA*, Regional Service Committees, Zonal Forums, and the World Board have the ability to forward potential candidates to the Human Resource Panel. These potential candidates would be considered for nomination to various world services trusted servant positions by the HRP. These positions are: WSC Cofacilitator, Human Resource Panel Member, and World Board Member.

The DEADLINE for receipt of these potential candidates from RSCs, Zonal Forums, and the World Board is 31 October 2011.

In support of your efforts, we ask that you please submit a Potential Candidate Submission Form for each candidate you are forwarding. Additionally, in an effort to add value to this process, we are asking each service body who forwards a potential candidate to also complete an RBZ Rationale Questionnaire about their selection process.

HOW TO FORWARD NAMES TO THE HRP FOR CONSIDERATION

There are many ways for RSCs, Zonal Forums, and the World Board to know people who may be considered as potential candidates. There may be someone who has been a trusted servant of one of these bodies, or someone who approaches one of these bodies and states she or he is interested in a particular NA World Services trusted servant position, or an individual NA member may suggest someone, to list just a few examples. It will be important for each service committee to consider how they will decide to forward potential candidates. We encourage your committee to discuss and develop a process that will work best for each of you.

We strongly suggest that service committees speak with the prospective candidate before forwarding their name to the HRP. This will save you time if the person is not interested; and this will also save the HRP time by not having to contact someone whose name was forwarded, only to discover that they are not interested. Any potential candidate must complete or update his or her World Pool Information Form (WPIF). It would be very helpful if your service committee passed along this request to those members. The WPIF is available online at: <http://www.na.org/?ID=HRP-wpif-default> or by calling or writing to NAWS.

Again, we suggest that the above service committees consider any individuals who may be qualified for any of these positions. Detailed discussion of each of these positions can be found in our service manual, *A Guide to World Services in Narcotics Anonymous*. Here is some information from the guide:

World Board Member:

- Ten years continuous clean time.

In addition to the qualities expressed in Concept Four such as humility, integrity, trustworthiness, and strong commitment to open communication, the following qualifications for nomination and election to the World Board are written to express the variety of skills and experience necessary to the board's optimum operation. A single individual may not have all of the qualifications listed below. These qualifications should not be viewed as a list of absolute requirements, but rather as an expression of the qualities and experience that will help the board to best serve our fellowship:

- History of both completing work independently and working well within a group.
- Familiarity with and commitment to the World Service Conference vision of a global fellowship demonstrated through world service or personal life experience.
- Familiarity with the Narcotics Anonymous service structure.
- Administrative skills.
- Experience with plan development and financial forecasting.
- Organizational and communication skills.

- Demonstrated organizational skills.
- Holding no other world service positions or responsibilities at the time of assuming the Cofacilitator's duties.
- A working knowledge of the Twelve Steps, Twelve Traditions, and Twelve Concepts of Narcotics Anonymous.

Hello All,

My apologies for missing our last meeting. I had already made arrangements with the Norman Oklahoma Winter Convention to speak on the 12 Concepts.

In February Ken and I attended the Western States Zonal Forum in Albuquerque N.M. The reason it was held there this year, was to save money. The World Board Member closest and most available to everyone attending lives in Albuquerque so it was held there. The local Area provided us with rides to and from the airport and rides to meetings. I found this forum to be very valuable for the insights of all of the Regional Delegates and Alternates present.

United States Service Conference - Before the Zonal Forum Ken and I both received many emails from the other RDs about the USSC among them was the "blue papers" the basis for proposing the USSC. The blue papers are written mostly in the first person with some references to we as a fellowship. I was expecting that there would probably be a lot of discussion about them during the zonal forum, there was not. In fact not one of the regions present was sending anyone to the USSC. When I pressed the issue, the general discussion was that there is an avenue already available for input on our service structure and the people pushing the USSC aren't willing to use that avenue or even take part in the discussion unless it's completely on their terms.

Proposed changes to our service structure - We presented everything we learned so far at the Regional Assembly last week. Love it or hate it, we need to continue discussing it and giving NAWS our direct input. Because even if we choose to vote against it. We want to be able to effect the thing we dislike most about it in case it does pass. And even those who like it can help make sure it's the best we can do. Ultimately this is something that requires our members be fully informed because it will affect us for years to come. Change is rarely easy or comfortable but it doesn't matter which side you're talking to, some changes will be necessary.

Environmental Scanning - We were presented with this tool at the Zonal Forum and used a very simple form of it at the Regional Assembly it seemed to be well received and I believe it will be a very useful tool for us if we choose to use it.

Social media - there was very little discussion on this topic. Some reference was given to some articles on it presented by one of the regions present, and that we need to be vigilant and discuss this within our own regions.

Funding and fund flow - Essentially what we presented at the Regional Assembly was what was presented to us at the Zonal Forum. On a personal note I believe that when we are in tight financial times it is very easy to point at each other and say we're wasting money. What is much harder to do, but much more productive is to, look at what we are personally, as Groups, Areas, Subcommittees, or Delegates, are responsible for. What we can do to extend it, and what we can do to generate whatever more we need to provide for our inevitable growth as a fellowship.

- On January 21, 2011, I received an email from Steve P. (our CFO) that he had received the D&O policy for 2011. I sent a note back asking him to forward the packet through the mail. Steve dropped the packet back into the mail and I received it on the 26th of January 2011. I have read the policy and there are no changes to report.
- On January 21, 2011, I sent a note to the Web Servant asking if they could improve the insurance request form that is on the website. The form can be filled out online but it can not be saved to a file or emailed directly. At the time of this request the form needed to be filled out and printed in order to be faxed or scanned back to be emailed. The hope was to simplify and improve the application process. On the 31st of January I received a test copy of the insurance request form from the Web Servant. I was able to input test information and send the completed form back to the BOD insurance address which, in turn, delivered the form, intact, to my personal email address. I sent them a thank you note for their service in simplifying the application process.
- On January 21, 2011, I sent an email to the World Board of Directors. I explained our general liability and our directors and officers policies and asked for their review and any guidance that the board may have on protecting our Region against insurable risks. I received a phone call on January 24, 2011, from a World Board member and we discussed at length the insurance position of the Arizona Region and some past cases that have financially and legally affected other Regions. The opinion of the World Board member is that our Region has taken the most effective and prudent steps

towards protecting ourselves and our members against most foreseeable risks.

- On February 9, 2011 a certificate of insurance was issued to the facility hosting the Safford Survivors group.
- On February 16, 2011, I talked to the chair of the meeting directory committee. There is some uncertainty about which meetings are recognized and covered by our general liability carrier. I sent an email note to our carrier asking about coverage for meetings listed in our meeting directory and about meetings held in clubhouses, private residences and in private businesses. Our underwriter answered the schedule question, stating that all meetings are covered by our policy whether they appear in the meeting list or not. The question about coverage for the different types of meeting facilities was not answered so I sent our carrier a follow up note. As of this report, no answer has been received from our carrier.
- On March 18, 2011 a certificate of insurance was issued to the facility hosting the Recovery in Queen Creek group.
