## **RCM II Report April 2011**

PASC

I attended the Regional meeting on March 20 and also the Regional Assembly in Tucson on March 12.

- The Regional Assembly was well attended, over 70 people, and very interesting. We started with doing what the RD's called an Environmental Scanning. Each table was asked to evaluate our region and create a plan for betterment. It helped to identify the top issues our Region feels is problematic. Some of the examples given were better attention to the newcomer, managing funds more responsibly, filling service commitments, and promoting sponsorship. The issue that was voted the top issue was managing funds more responsibly. This tied in perfectly with the RD and RD2's topic of Funding NA services. They shared the statistics from the annual WSC about expenses. I will attach to my minutes. These are staggering numbers. Some brought up that it is better to take care of home first and others felt in NA the World wide fellowship is home.
- We discussed the 25% 50% 25% model for fund flow from the new IP Funding NA Services. Some homegroups are following this model as it was reported in the WSC figures.
- We also discussed the service structure project which I have reported on a few times earlier in the year. There is a new timeline for implementation. It was originally 4 years till implementation, which would have been 2012 but it has been extended till 2014. We should be thinking about getting together as an area to discuss these ideas and models for the new structure.
- There was a new board member elected from the South Central area
- The regional meeting offered the following:
- At the RCM forum we discussed giving the ARCNA Convention Committee \$2000 additional for a hotel deposit but neglected the South Central Area's (Casa Grande) money for 50 Basic texts for the numerous prison requests for literature and H&I meetings that they get.

- We also discussed keeping the convention out of 5 star resorts. The RCM's are concerned about the convention becoming too exclusive.
- The Convention site locator posed the question should we look for hotels in casinos? I would like to take the conscience of this group back to region to answer that question.
- There will be a NAWA literature price increase on June 1.
- The Draft review of Living Clean will be in this years CAR report for approval.
- Human Resource Panel nominations are due by 12/31/2011. I will attach a nomination form in my minutes.
- The CAR Assembly will be in January, They are looking for bids for the March GSR Assembly. If anyone is interested in doing that we would need an idea proposed.
- The BOD is replacing the stolen debit card machine for \$690.00
- The sites for the 2012 ARCNA potentially are the Scottsdale Doubletree and the Wyndam downtown. Flagstaff has a new convention center but no hotels directly attached. It was suggested The site locator look at sites in northern Arizona as some new hotels are being built.
- It seems that \$1,514 was left unprocessed in the debit machine from last years ARCNA and not discovered until the machine was used at the New Years event. We are holding funds till all those charges clear. There was no world donation.
- ARCNA registrations are low and the push is on to pre-register.

**East Valley** – looking for a Bluesfest logo by April 10. Contact is Rich – 602

**Navapache** - will have Festival of Recovery Fluyers out soon. The region gave them the remaining seed money.

**South Central** - Are the new regional volleyball champions. They are still in need of Basic texts for the heavy prison requests that come to them. They have decided as an area that what they need is people to commit over money or donations.. If you want you can donate books directly to them.

**South East** – They have a few barbeques planned for spring and summer and you can find that info on NATucson.org. Their H&I is trying to get into Marana jails. They are planning a GSR learning day to educate people willing to serve in that position.

**West Valley** – Campvention April 1 – 3, Lake Pleasant. They have had a reduction in attendance in their events. They are wanting to publish their newsletter on the website.

**Yavapai** – Donated 10 Basic Texts to SW Area and they have published an area meeting list.

- Regional H&I has sent lots of literature to inmates and assigned 6 new sponsees to sponsors in Sponsorship behind the walls.
- The PR is going to submit a proposal for a more professional looking booth for their events.
- Elections for the next ARCNA Committee are in May.
- The Webservant is now its own stand alone committee.

NA at the VA asked me to talk to the Meeting list Chair about making the font larger for the meeting lists. I did that. The Chair is going to get a price from the printer for doing that but he had some information and suggestions for the group:

- Reformatting is a cost issue. We were paying .11 a list before this and now we are paying .07.
- There hasn't been many requests for the change
- If we go to a larger size paper and they Trifold it, it may not fit in the meeting racks, we would have to have an 6-8 pane fold which is more expensive.
- You can experiment on your own with the file. It is a pdf and perhaps you could print it to a larger size and staple it. The South East Area prints their own from the PDF for H&I and PR.
- Bill's number is 480-217-4656 and he would be happy to help you find a solution until he can get the cost. If the cost is too high, as it is compounded by the issues I have stated, he is willing to assist you in any way he can.

Conference beyond their defined role. Human Resource Panel members are often invited to participate in discussion or presentation sessions at the World Service Conference.

### **Membership Qualifications**

In addition to the qualities expressed in Concept Four such as humility, integrity, trustworthiness, and strong commitment to open communication, following are qualifications for nomination and election to the Human Resource Panel:

- Ability to protect confidential information held in the World Pool and revealed during the Human Resource Panel nominations process.
- History of both completing work independently and working well within a group.
- Familiarity with the Narcotics Anonymous service structure.
- Organizational and communication skills.
  
- Ability to donate sufficient time to attend meetings and to fulfill the additional commitments of Human Resource Panel membership.
- A working knowledge of the Twelve Steps, Traditions, and Concepts.

### **Clean Time Requirement**

All Human Resource Panel members must have a minimum of eight (8) years clean.

### **Terms**

The term of office for the Human Resource Panel member will be two (2) conference cycles. Panel members cannot serve two consecutive terms. The Human Resource Panel cannot nominate an outgoing Human Resource Panel member to any NA World Service trusted servant position. Once off the panel, former members are eligible for nomination consideration.

### **Decision-Making, Panel Leadership, and Removal of Members**

**Decision-making:** The Human Resource Panel should strive for consensus. When a vote is required, a minimum of a majority of seated Human Resource Panel members represents a decision of the Human Resource Panel.

**Panel leadership:** Approximately halfway through each conference cycle the Human Resource Panel will select a panel leader. The Panel Leader will act as a liaison from the Human Resource Panel at the World Service Conference, and in interactions with the World Board and NAWS staff.

**Removal of Members:** Members may be removed from the Human Resource Panel by a two-thirds majority vote of the Human Resource Panel, and with concurrence of the World Board. Cause for removal includes, but is not limited to the following:

1. Failure to attend two meetings within a twelve-month period.
2. Relapse as defined by the Fellowship of Narcotics Anonymous.
3. Misappropriation of Narcotics Anonymous World Services funds.

Once removed from the Human Resource Panel, former members may only be reinstated by an action of the World Service Conference.

### **The World Pool**

The World Pool is a database or compilation of information about NA members willing and qualified to be considered for service. The World Pool will be utilized as a resource for identifying potential candidates for NA World Service trusted servant positions, and World Board projects, work groups, or other NAWS assignments.

### **Purpose of the Human Resource Panel**

The purpose of the Human Resource Panel is to identify NA members whose skills, talents, and experience support their ability to be most qualified as NA World Service trusted servants. The panel is responsible for forwarding to the World Service Conference a list of those most qualified candidates (nominees) for consideration and selection by the WSC. The Human Resource Panel also administers the World Pool, a resource for identifying potential candidates for NA World Service trusted servant positions, and World Board projects, work groups, or other NAWS assignments.

### **General Duties**

The duties of the Human Resource Panel are to develop, maintain, and implement a nominations process that results in the identification of the most qualified candidates for consideration for service by the World Service Conference. In support of this, the Human Resource Panel will cooperate with all of NA World Services to maintain current descriptions of the skills, talents, and experience necessary to successfully fulfill the tasks of WSC elected positions.

The Human Resource Panel utilizes various NAWS publications to communicate with NA members worldwide in an effort to keep members up to date on the panel's activity and any pending nominations process deadlines. The panel welcomes input from all interested members on any aspect of their work.

As a part of the nominations process the Human Resource Panel will:

- Screen information of eligible members of the World Pool to identify those most qualified to be considered for election to NA World Service trusted servant positions.
- Inform qualified members of the World Pool, and service bodies who can forward names for consideration to the Human Resource Panel (NA regions, NA zones, and the World Board) of the current descriptions of the skills, talents, and experience necessary to successfully fulfill the positions of World Board member, WSC Cofacilitator and Human Resource Panel member.
- Interview all potential candidates who meet the clean time requirement for each position and are forwarded for consideration by NA regions, NA zones, or the World Board, independent from and after any other initial screening process.
- Provide the World Service Conference with a list of nominees best qualified for election to the World Board, WSC Cofacilitator, and Human Resource Panel. These lists, for the purposes of election at the World Service Conference, will not be governed by any minimum candidate-to-open position ratio; the maximum ratio should be limited to no more than two (2) candidates to each open position.
- Facilitate the Elections Session of the World Service Conference.
- Be available throughout the meeting of the World Service Conference to answer participants' questions about the nominations process, without violating the confidentiality of World Pool members, potential candidates, nominees, or their references.

### **Membership and Participation**

The Human Resource Panel will consist of up to four members elected by majority vote of the World Service Conference. While elected at the World Service Conference, panel members are not conference participants and do not have the ability to participate at the World Service

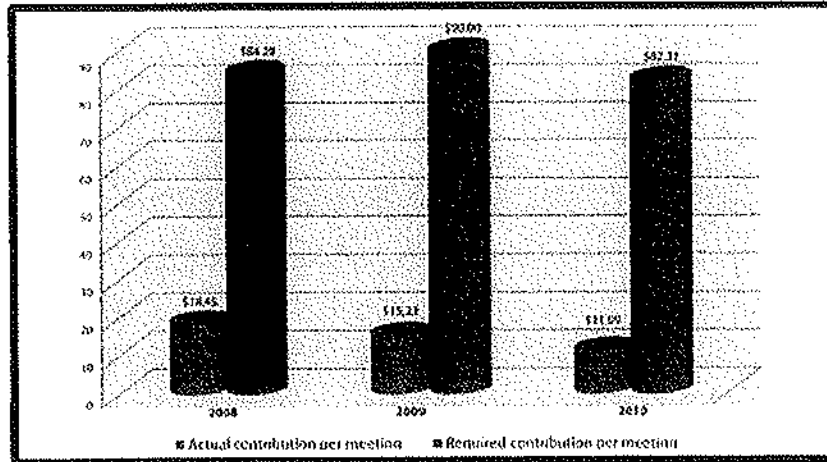

## Help Line Report April 2, 2011

The Help Line took on three new volunteers last month, two of which had to step down due to illness. Six new potential volunteers are waiting for training and there are exactly six shifts in need of additional help. Our secretary position is still open, suggested clean time is six months. I intend to fill this position when my term as chair is over, if no one else has stepped up by then. The new version of SmartOffice doesn't have all the features to support as many shifts as we need after all. Another company needs to be found if we still wish to have three hour shifts. Robin and I are going to research other hosted voice over IPs so we can have leverage when requesting a refund from AccessLine for the money we wasted on the second SmartOffice. (2-135.2c) In East Valley Area news, the motion to not fund 1/3 of WSLD expenses was passed.

At West Valley Area Angie M. was unanimously voted in as Help Line Liaison. I attended their Area Service Committee last month and was able to clarify the cost of bills and how it would change if we switched to a toll free number through AccessLine. Their service body wants more information about the toll free number before they vote on it. They'd like to know if the rate is competitive, what area codes will be able to utilize the number, and if we can choose our own number to spell out a phrase.

The Help Line event went well on March 20th. We had ten volunteers show up at 11am to set up. The start time was 1pm and people were so eager they started showing up a half hour early; by 1pm there were already 35 people in attendance. There was plenty of food and drinks with little left over. \$119 was donated during the BBQ. Three people stepped up to take phone line shifts. The speaker meeting had 37 people in attendance and \$66.55 was collected in 7th Tradition.

Our next subcommittee meeting will be held at Denny's, 3456 W. Bethany Home Rd., on Tuesday April 12th. For those who wish to buy dinner and socialize before we get down to business please show up by 6:30 pm. The meeting will be from 7-8 pm, everyone is welcome to attend.

We updated the NA Phoenix PR PowerPoint for a presentation to Maricopa County Probation Department. Because of this taping, Greg W. to provide the presentation since he has a great deal of experience in this type presentation. We had concerns re anonymity. Per input from the World Service Officer PR liaisons, we should not identify as members of NA in these presentations since they are taped, but only as PR people for NA. Nancy G. and Greg attended, Greg presented, we had only two probation employees there; however, it was taped for further training distribution. Also, we discussed the possibility of putting our literature racks in the PO offices and I will follow up in a few weeks with coordinators at the Probation Department.

I was supposed to attend but had unexpected visitors from out of town wasn't able to.

We are working through the other Phoenix precincts now and East Valley will handle Tempe PD if they decide to pursue this.

We are pooling our tri-area efforts and putting more money toward radio spots for a summer radio campaign. The phone lines will track to see if this is working with new membership/calls. I attended Region this month because so much of what the PR committees do is regional in nature.

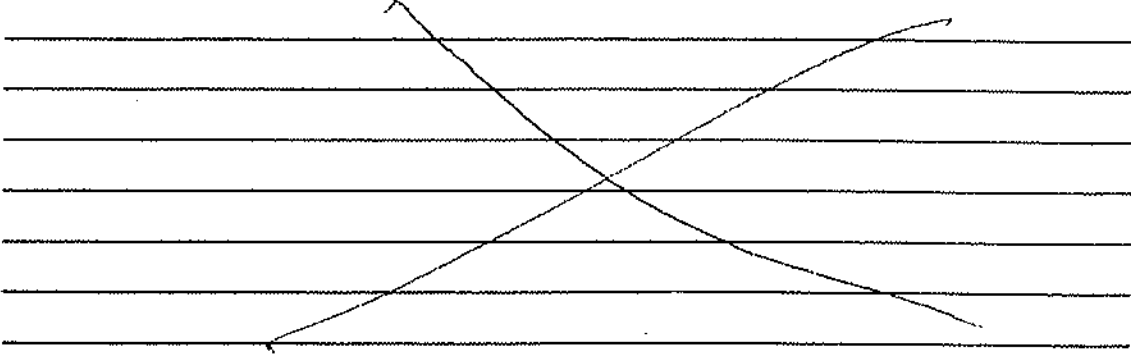
