Hey everyone,

Sorry I'm not there today, but Vernon, who's taking on being our vice-chair, is there to deliver this report. Looks like there were 557 calls in the month of November, and of those, 39 were voice mails. The Accessline bill was \$96.25, and the Century Link bill was \$58.81. That's \$155.06 split three ways, that comes to \$51.69 per area. We could definitely use some volunteers on Tuesday. The midnight shift has a single volunteer, and the afternoon shift has two. They're totally on top of it though, so if you take that afternoon shift, you'll be competing for calls with folks that rarely let one slip by.

We're finally making some progress on new recordings that ask callers to unblock anonymous calls if they want a voicemail returned. We're also talking about a newsletter to share stories of volunteers that might inspire others to participate. Below is a story from a volunteer in the East Valley. ...Robin

A CALL FROM WASHINGTON STATE

I was working the NA Helpline one afternoon and received a phone call from a distressed father in Seattle, Washington. He was asking about the fellowship and what he could do to help his 21-year-old son who was in Arizona. I informed him that we only give out details on meeting times and locations. However, I could tell that the gentleman was very upset and in distress over his son's condition. He told me that he planned to fly down to Arizona to find his son and try to get him help with his addiction problem. Being an addict in recovery manning the Helpline I know that another person cannot make the decision for an addict to seek recovery. The addict needs to make the call, and the decision to seek help, for themselves.

I gave the gentleman my cell number and told him to pass my number onto his son. I advised him that he shouldn't be making such a long distance trip for an addict in full active addiction and that his son needed to make the decision to seek help for himself. After another week had passed I heard from the father that his son had sold his car, used all the money to get high, and was now homeless, hopeless, and penniless.

After another week had passed the addict himself finally called me asking for help. I told him that if he had enough and was willing, I would meet him at Community Bridges and help him check into a detox facility. After meeting there we sat and talked. Over the course of several hours I got to know this young addict and I was very sad to hear his story and how lonely he was here in Arizona with no family or home.

After spending a day in detox he checked himself out and continued to use. His father continued to call me and informed me that his son was still using and repeatedly checking himself into, and out of, the detox facility. Finally, over a month after the original call from the father, the addict called me from detox. He told me that he finally had enough and that after completing detox he was signing up to go to the Salvation Army for six months of treatment. I was incredibly happy that this addict had made it through his using, was still alive, and seeking recovery.

Thanks to my Higher Power, the message of NA, and to all of the friends that helped me when I was in need.

**Public Relations Committee Phoenix Area
Meeting December 2011**

We have a few things cooking but again, this committee needs support. We will move our meetings to the 2nd Monday of the month (that's December 12, 2011), at the Paradise Bakery at 12th St and Glendale. It's located on the southwest corner. We plan to meet at 7 p.m.

- ✓ I have not heard back from JC Lincoln. They have the brochure. The brochure is designed to be given to addicts who are either admitted or come into the emergency room at the hospital, which refers them to NA. We await the administrator's approval but this may not occur for a few more months. I need to contact another valley hospital to try to do this same process at their facility, as well.
- ✓ We are still working to get our NA business cards in Phoenix Police Department vehicles. Committee members contacted three divisions but we still need people who have flexible work hours who can visit the precincts during the day to meet with police community liaison officers. I think one of our new members may be able to do that. West Valley is using the list to contact officers in their precincts.
- ✓ We are planning a spring flyer day where we blanket Phoenix with NA posters (small) and business cards, followed by potluck at a park. The Activities Committee (Phoenix) graciously agreed to support this, so I will know more today after I talk to Frank. We will have a potluck and speaker meeting ~~today~~ at our meeting we will divide up the city and try to do more planning.
- ✓ We are still distributing *Basic Texts* and *It Works* distributed to halfway houses in Phoenix. So far they have been distributed to the federal halfway house on Roosevelt, Dignity Program, Calvary and both TLCs.
- ✓ The best idea I have at this moment is to hold a Phoenix learning event for the media, nonprofits, and other social service agencies. We would find a central location (I'm thinking JC Lincoln's community center in Sunnyslope), invite the media and non profits, send out press releases, then hold a two-hour meet and greet with a "What is NA" presentation. I find in about one-third of the meetings I attend, parents and young people are present checking out NA. I think it's time for us to make an effective effort to cooperate with Naranon and invite them to participate in this event. In keeping with our Sixth Tradition, we would not "endorse" them, but merely allow a speaker from Naranon to present and to place their literature there, as well. I am meeting with Rose, the Regional PR rep, to see how the region can support this.
- ✓ We have been asked to present a PR presentation to the City of Phoenix Parks & Rec department in Sunnyslope. They work with at-risk youths and have a lot of need for information, especially for parents. The problem is this—I don't have a projector to show our Powerpoint presentation; so will work with region to see how we can perhaps find someone with one. They are not cheap, so I'm not sure about buying one. I think they range from \$300 to \$550 and would be useful. Again, I'll talk to region about this.
